I know I've said it before, but it is always good to be reminded of those who need to be noticed – and to say thank you, whatever the time of year.

May this springtime be blessed for all of us and be full of thankfulness!

### **NEWS FROM WANSFORD AND KINGS CLIFFE PRACTICE**

This month we would like to tell you about our Medicines Management Team here at Wansford Health Campus.

Medicines Management Team?? Who are they and what do they do...you ask. Let me tell you.

The team comprises of 2 clinical pharmacists (Dipak and Arvind), 2 pharmacy technician (Lewis and Steph) and two repeat medication clerks (Lindsey and Kim). We are a different team to our colleagues in Wansford Pharmacy, but we do work very closely together.

In a nutshell we deal with all medication queries and issues within the practice.



- Medication reviews
- Hypertension (blood pressure) reviews and medication changes
- Sorting out hospital letters and issuing appropriate medication
- We answer medication queries from patients
- We provide medication and prescribing guidance to the practice team i.e. the Drs and nurses
- Sort out blood tests for medications that need regular monitoring
- Update patient's record with blood pressure and weight etc, to ensure your medication continues to be safely prescribed.

If you have a medication query then contact the reception, who will then add you to our daily list. We will do our best to sort the query out on the day and may call you to discuss further.





## Spring invertebrates in the Garden



Spring sees the garden come to life and with the first shoots, buds and flowers also come the first awakening invertebrates, reviving from their winter hibernation. Body clocks speeding up they emerge from sheds, tree hollows, larval stages or egg and bring with them the regular buzz of life.

Some of our first returning insects are gueen

Some of our first returning insects are queen bumble bees (they are larger than the workers seen later in the year), gathering food and materials to start their nests often found as early as March. As we move into April/May it is the solitary bees which you can spot if you have any spring flowering plants

in your garden. There are over 250 species of solitary bee some have specific plant food sources such as the Sea aster mining bee, some live in sand dunes or walls such as the masonry bees and some such as the Tawny mining bee can be found burrowing into your lawn.

Lifting slabs and rocks will uncover many other invertebrates that are still essentially at rest and nocturnal by nature such as millipedes,

centipedes, woodlice and beetles. To encourage our early bees into your garden it is essential to have a good show of flowers preferably year round. Solitary bees can also be encouraged by creating your very own bee nest boxes, either buy an approved bespoke nest box see <a href="https://www.buglife.org.uk/shop-categories/bug-houses">https://www.buglife.org.uk/shop-categories/bug-houses</a> for examples or make you own:

#### You will need:

- Hollow plant stems or bamboo canes
- Garden twine or string
- Saw or knife to cut the canes
- A nail or hook to attach the bee hotel to

#### Method:

- Cut the hollow plant stems into 10-20cm sections. The diameter of the holes should not exceed 10mm and ideally be closer to 6mm.
- Tie a bundle of 15-20 tubes together with garden twine or string.
- Hang the bee hotel in a sunny but sheltered area about 5 feet about the ground. The side of a shed or on a trellis is ideal. (Preferably south facing).

You will know if a solitary bee such as a mason bee or leaf-cutter bee is using your bee hotel if the hollow tubes are blocked with a leaf or mud. A female solitary bee will usually use one hollow tube, she will create a series of cells each containing a food parcel of pollen and nectar for the grub. Only a single egg is laid in each cell.

The adult solitary bee eventually seals the entrance to the tube with mud or a perfectly sized section of leaf. You may notice some of your garden plants have half-moon or full-circle shaped cuttings. These are made by leafcutter bees which cut them using their scissor-like mandibles.

### **NEWS FROM WANSFORD PHARMACY**

Spring has finally arrived. With a mix of warmer weather and April showers, this time of year can be rather changeable. The pharmacy world is no different.

Major changes started across the NHS, this spring, with the establishing of a brand new "Pharmacy First" service. Wansford pharmacy is working closely with Wansford & Kings Cliffe Practice so this works as seamlessly as possible. The following conditions are now going to be the remit of community pharmacy, without the need for referral from your GP:

- New urinary tract infections (strictly females and 16 to 64 year olds only)
- Shingles (18+ year olds)
- Impetigo (1+ year olds)
- Infected insect bites (1+ year olds)
- Acute sore throat (5+ year olds)
- Acute sinusitis (12+ year olds)
- Acute ear infection of the middle ear (1 to 17 year olds only)

As spring progresses, coughs and colds start to wane. This is when the hay-fever season gets started, with tree pollen the major culprit.

- If you suffer from hay-fever, prevention is the key word, rather than treatment. You should start using an antihistamine tablet, preferably a once daily, non-drowsy option, a couple of weeks before the expected onset of symptoms.
- Alternatively, or in addition for those particularly affected, a steroid nasal spray can be used.
   These take around 10 days to reach their full potential. Perseverance and regular daily use is key to success.

What we can be sure of is that our pharmacy team is highly trained and ready for these changes, whether seasonal or NHS driven. Think pharmacy first, because we can always signpost or refer onwards where needed.



### WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL



As those of you who read the Wansford Parish Council report every month will know, I was co-opted back on to the council in January and then elected Temporary Chairman until the Vice-Chairman, Richard

Clarke, returns from his southern hemisphere tour. Again, we extend our best wishes to ClIr John Stannage for a speedy recovery from illness. Each month we ask a different Parish Councillor to produce this report in their own style and I volunteered to do this one.

We have been without a clerk since December, but have been very fortunate to have Charlie Newman and then Elinor Beesely standing in to take minutes for us and give us the benefit of their experience as Parish Clerks. Elinor has kindly agreed to take the minutes for us at April's meeting. If anyone is interested in being our clerk, please contact Jane Taylor-Pitt (jane.taylor-pitt@wansford-pc.gov.uk) (for details – see January's edition of Living Villages).

Wansford Parish is north of the River Nene and we come under Peterborough City Council, a Unitary Authority. The village south of the river is part of Sibson-cum-Stibbington Parish which comes under Huntingdon, which is part of Cambridge County Council. We are very fortunate to own Wansford Community Hall - (www.wansfordcommunityhall.co.uk) - which can accommodate up to 36 people and is available for hire at only £4 per hire (contact me on 07597 794862 or at tim.pearson@wansford-pc.gov.uk) We meet on the second Monday of each month in the Community Hall at a new time of 7:00pm, and try not to take more than 2 hours. Members of the public are invited to attend our meetings, raise matters in Public Time and contribute to discussion when invited. You are welcome to leave the meetings at any time. The Agenda has to be posted on the Notice Board on the church wall at least 3 working days before each meeting, our next being on Monday 8th April.

Some items from the last meeting:

**Peterborough Local Plan:** The next Local Plan meeting will be held in Summer 2024. Wansford has limited need for its own Neighbourhood Plan, but is well aware that proposals in adjoining areas can have a significant impact on Wansford. Creating a Neighbourhood Plan would be advantageous, but an enormous amount of work for a small Parish like ours. It was agreed that Cllr Taylor-Pitt and Cllr Clarke would ask to meet with other parishes, prior to the next PCC Local Plan meeting, to discuss the possibility of creating a joint Neighbourhood Plan.

**The Wildlife Trust website - Wansford Nature Reserve:** Currently, access for the public is restricted by one padlocked gate and a 'no unauthorised access' sign on another gate. We are to write to The Wildlife Trust to ask for the permissive path to be re-opened.

**Proposed bus route linking Peterborough, Castor, Ailsworth, Wansford, Wittering and Stamford:** The Bus Campaign Group is continuing to fight for this service, and for it to run hourly.

### SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Sibson-cum Stibbington Parish Council met on **7th March** where the following matters were discussed.

### The Future of Christie Hall Management Committee.

Lisa Chambers representing the committee spoke to those in attendance about the history and legacy of the Christie Hall which has been a pivotal space for the three villages (Stibbington, Wansford & Thornhaugh). The building and land is currently leased from the Royal British Legion (RBL) and The Christie Hall Management Committee is made up of a small number of people who between them cover a range of key duties. Whilst they have been happy to undertake these takes for a substantial period of time they are now reaching a point where they would each like to start planning and implementing succession plans. The hall is well utilised by fitness and well being groups as well as private events e.g. parties. Lisa's reason for attending the Parish Council meeting was to highlight to Parishioners and Councillors that there support in finding people who would be interested in any role on the Christie Hall Management Committee they should get in touch.

### Speeding on Elton Road.

Parishioners are extremely concerned about the volume of speeding vehicles passing this stretch of road. It was explained that there had recently been a near miss whereby an older resident who was putting their bins out was nearly pulled over after the drag that rushed passed her from a speeding vehicle. The concerns over speeding were also extended to the 30mph zone on Elton Road. The resident plans to escalate these concerns to the Neighbourhood Policing Team. The Parish is happy to support these efforts where possible, including the option of a traffic survey.

### Swim-Run event.

After careful review Councillors agreed and are happy for the event to pass through the parish under the circumstances explained to them. It was deemed that there will be minimal to no impact on the village if the event is delivered as per the information received.

Various payments were approved & planning applications were discussed. The next Parish Council Meeting is scheduled for **2nd May 2024**.

### THORNHAUGH PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of Thornhaugh Parish Council was held on 5th March 2024 in St Andrew's Church. It was chaired by Chris Smith and present were Louise Molesworth, Nicky Rogers, two members of the public and Deirdre McCumiskey (Clerk).

There were apologies for absence from Yana Clipsham, Camilla Plumb and Gavin Elsey (PCC Ward Councillor).

Police Matters - Rural Parish Police Surgery -The next meeting will be held 4.00 - 6.00 pm on 21st March 2024 in Wittering Bowls' Club Pavilion.

The members of the public present asked if it would be possible to plant some flowers/bulbs at the entrance to the village off the A1 as they felt it would smarten up the corner and make the entrance to the village more attractive. They offered to help with a maintenance plan. The Chair said she would check whether this needed PCC permission.

Highways Issues - the Chair had no further updates on layby or entrance/exit despite chasing emails.

Social Events – Nicky Rogers suggested that a Harvest Festival event could be held in late September/early October. Nicky Rogers suggested we could ask Peter Sharpley if he would consider letting the residents use the paddock on Meadow Lane. Alan Frost and Joan Bolton Frost offered the use of their garden as an alternative and/or their gazebo for the event. The Chair will ask Peter Sharpley. Appreciation was expressed to Nicki Higgins for arranging two community events in the church in April 2024.

State of Russell Hill to A47 – the Chair said that as yet, there had been no response from Peterborough Highways despite support from Gavin Elsey.

Local Plan - PCC sent out a request for comment to Parish Councils to inform the draft Local Plan relating to Housing Development (Strategic Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment - SHELAA). This was an early consultation on land that has been offered to PCC as potential for development to meet the next Local Plan (2023 to 2044). The land offered in the plan is at a very early stage and none of the land offers have, as yet been assessed for suitability for inclusion in the final Local Plan. PCC have been given a Government target of c22,000 dwellings over the life of the plan and this stage of consultation was to get first thoughts from Parish Councils on the land offered. Inclusion of the land at this stage does not mean automatic inclusion in the final Plan. The land offered will be considered for inclusion in the Draft Local Plan which will be sent out, hopefully in August 2024 for further consultation. The land will be assessed for suitability against a range of criteria, including comments from Parish Councils. The discussions at an extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council were also informed by consultation with other PCs and from attendance at a City Planning meeting held on 11th January. Thornhaugh Parish Council submitted their thoughts on 18th January. Our response covered the following issues: Village envelopes, Conservation area, ancient woodlands, road network infrastructure, environmental impact, loss of agricultural land, emergency services impact, education, public transport, residents' quality of life, and property values.

State of Pavements on Russell – Louise Molesworth had not yet sent the photographs to Gavin Elsey, but the Clerk will ask him for an update.

Planning Applications - 23/00852/FUL - Proposed Cattery, temporary mobile home and small pet crematorium at Magnolia House, Old Oundle Road, Thornhaugh - No Objections/Support - Awaiting Decision and 24/00017/CTR - Remove all 4no. conifer trees at 14 Russell Hill, Thornhaugh - Neutral to accept the decision of the Tree Officer but to request replacement trees are planted at the site - Permitted

Annual Donations Agreed – Living Villages £100 and Wansford & Thornhaugh PCC £190 which are both same as in 2023.

Karen Jones had once again agreed to undertake the internal audit of the accounts. The Parish Council is no longer required to have an external audit of the accounts.

The Chair had received enquiry about insurance for litter pickers being covered for working alongside major highways. It was confirmed that there are no restrictions on this, but an appropriate Safety Assessment must be done, and a sample was provided. This was sent to Nikki Higgins for information.

Reported water leak on Russell Hill on 29th February. Following checking by Anglian Water, they have confirmed that this is not their equipment and is not water from them. A further enquiry has been submitted seeking assistance to trace which services are provided from that manhole.

Thanks were expressed to Lee Ward for clearing leaves from drain on Russell Hill opposite The Rectory. This is always a bad drain in rainy weather because leaves and detritus coming down the road and off the fields collect and stop the water running away. Please can anyone passing it do the same to keep the water flowing?

Thanks were expressed to Adrian Rodgers for checking the defibrillator on a weekly basis. Louise Molesworth will explore the possibility of a refresher course to include the basics of using the defibrillator and also basic first aid.

The next Thornhaugh Parish Council Meeting will take place at 7.00 pm on **7th May 2024** in **St Andrew's Church.** This will be the Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Annual General Meeting
