It is good, though to reflect upon places, and indeed people, that we so often take for granted. So often in our churches – and churchyards – things happen behind the scenes that we only notice when they don't happen, if you see what I mean. Thank you to all those "behind the scene-ers" that make such a difference to our lives!

As we know, the situation with the pandemic in our country, and in our area, changes rapidly and what is happening now as I write towards the end of July may well be different from what it happening when you read your magazine. However, as I write, we are still being cautious in the church and not making too many changes to our covid precautions too quickly, even though the official regulations have been lifted. COMMUNICARE Wansford & Kings Cliffe Patient Participation Group

A joint meeting of the officials and the Practice Manager, Mrs Kirstie Lawes, was held last month. A whole range of matters were discussed at length including the current low level of funds – it is hoped that as Covid restrictions are eased various ideas for fund raising can be instigated. Monies held by the Group that have been 'ring fenced' for certain projects are yet to be utilized – in particular the proposed creation of a community garden at the Kings Cliffe Active site – discussions are ongoing with all parties concerned but it is hoped that a positive outcome will be achieved in the not too distant future.

In addition to the new doctors who have recently joined the practice, Catherine Ofiaeli and Catherine Parnell, Mrs Lawes informed the meeting that a male doctor, Rob Houghton, would also now be working at the surgery one day a week.

The national Covid vaccination programme continues at local centres – anyone who has not yet taken up the offer of a jab is strongly encouraged to do so without delay, particularly with the current 'third wave' engulfing the country. Mrs Lawes confirmed that plans are now in hand for the role out of the annual flu injections commencing early autumn – however it is not yet known how and when the proposed Covid booster jab will become available – this information will of course be circulated as soon as possible.

A matter which is cause for concern is the proposed NHS Digital Data Sharing. It was agreed by the meeting that this subject has not been widely promoted in the media and the majority of the population are probably unaware of it and its possible implications. The original deadline for patients to 'opt-out' of the scheme has now been extended to 1st September but with this date fast approaching, it is important that individuals take the opportunity to read up on the proposals and make an informed decision about the sharing of their own personal medical details. A quick and easy channel is via Google – NHS Digital Data Sharing – which offers a whole range of options including a direct online method to opt out through the official NHS website – alternatively this can be done by letter to your GP.

It is hoped that a back-to-normal general patients meeting can be held in late September – this will be our AGM and although there will be a small amount of business matters, we plan to have guest speakers – full details will be published in the September issues of local magazines and on the surgery website.

Everybody needs good neighbours. Here's why you can - and should - join the crime prevention army. Eileen Le Voi Safe Local Trades

As life starts to get back to a new kind of normal, a major winner of the pandemic has got to be the nation's community spirit, highlighted in the 4th of July 'Thank you Day'.

So, let's keep that going – and look at one easy but overwhelmingly effective way of supporting your local community; signing up to your local Neighbourhood Watch!

Not only will neighbours be joining forces against crime in the area, but can also be part of an invaluable network with many benefits – and be the eyes and ears of your street.



Neighbourhood Watch works as a team where everyone comes together to make their communities safer and improve the wellbeing of its residents, working with the Police, Local Authorities and many other voluntary and professional organisations.

Living in a NHW area can:

- Lead to lower home insurance.
- Allow neighbours to keep in touch via a private Facebook or WhatsApp group
- Promote a communication system to warn about crimes in the local area; ie cold callers operating in your street or just to ask, 'which colour bin is it this week?'
- Give a visible warning to burglars that the area is a NHW zone through displaying window stickers and road signs

The unfortunate news is that as lockdown eases in the UK, we're expecting a rise in burglaries. The NHW association has recently partnered with the Home Office to run a social media awareness campaign to alert those most at risk, giving them practical tools that are proven to prevent burglary by nearly 50 times.

The 'There's safety in neighbours' message – featuring the iconic black and yellow branding – encourages use of the WIDE combination of security measures in the home.

Properties with the WIDE security combination \square window locks, indoor lights on a timer, door double or deadlocks and external lights on a timer or sensor - are nearly 50 times more protected from burglary than those with no security.

There are many successful and active NHW schemes in and around your area and they are easy to join. The association will support residents in helping them to develop a greater understanding of how to prevent crime by improving community vigilance, and by reporting suspicious incidents.

A really important aspect of a NHW scheme is to improve well-being in the community by encouraging activities aimed at improving neighbourliness, reducing loneliness and by fostering a community spirit.



Public Time: It was agreed that members of the public could participate in the discussion on items on the Agenda or bring up their own concerns but on a time limited basis (10 minutes)

Planning

There were four planning applications, all tree related, two of which had already been permitted. The other two were referred to The Tree Officer at PCC

Around the Village

<u>Telephone box/ Defibrillator</u>: Time for sprucing this up as its now going pink. A purpose designed kit will be purchased to do the job. Cllr Stannage inspects the equipment every month and reported that, to date, it has never been used.

<u>Vehicle Activated Speed sign</u> (currently on Old North Road). This has been deemed a success as it is achieving its aim of slowing down traffic as it enters the village.

<u>Road Signs:</u> Cllr Handley is progressing the removal of the large directional signs around the village and the purchase and erection of three more traditional, finger post sign.

<u>Footpath Warden:</u> Cllr Garner volunteered to take on this role. He will liaise with PCC and neighbouring Parish Councils to establish a plan for routes, maintenance etc

Right of Way from Nene Close to Community Hall: a document verifying the long term usage of the path has been sent to PCC.

<u>Old Leicester Road/A47 junction:</u> PCC have at last agreed to send someone out to assess the safety aspect of the junction.

<u>Dualling of the A47:</u> Cllr Clarke gave an update. The design documents (DCO) have now been sent to the Planning Inspectorate and in due course a notice will be served whereby the public can register to comment on the proposals.

Meanwhile, Highways England have produced a 55 page report on traffic modelling at the Western roundabout which dismisses the idea of using "intelligent" traffic lights instead of a roundabout. However, an independent expert modelling report has shown that there would be a 30% improvement in traffic flow if lights were used.

Correspondence:

A letter was received from an 8 year old girl asking if the plastic waste bins in the village could be replaced with wooden ones. WPC replied that this would be done as and when they needed replacing.

There was also an enquiry about the feasibility of a litter pick around the village with regard to insurance. The Chairman responded that, as they were authorised by the Parish Council, they would be covered.

And Finally... "we have a wonderful facility here with the River Nene but with no access to the river bank" quote from Cllr Garner. There followed a discussion on the potential and viability of establishing a leisure area on the bank, including launching facilities. However, this is made more complex as there are several owners of parcels of land near the picnic area between the A47 and the river bank. This idea will continue to be progressed by WPC.

Flooding issues - full report expected from HDC.

Planning Applications- 21/01109/HHFUL and 21/01110/LBC – 4 London Road. Comments posted on HDC Planning Portal.

There were reports of Fireworks being activated along the Elton Road late at night causing distress to both residents and animals. It is illegal to activate Fireworks after 11pm at night and if reported to the Police, it could be considered a crime. It would be helpful if neighbours could be informed prior to this type of activity taking place.

An Invitation to join Virtual roundtable meetings with the Police and Crime Commissioner for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough was received and read out at the meeting.

Street Name numbering – The Old Hangar, Sibson Airfield, Sibson is now to be known as: The Lodge, The Old Hangar, Sibson Airfield, Sibson.

The LHI Grant applied for by the Parish Council has been approved. Talks are ongoing with Highways England regarding Old North Road Stibbington.

The Sign in New Lane damaged and a repair will take place.

Cycle West - This application has been refused by Peterborough City Council.

Wansford Village Sign – long overdue for replacement and will be ordered ASAP.

Complaints have been received from PC Staff and Contractors being verbally abused, when operating near the Wansford Bridge. Both the PC and HDC take any abuse of staff very seriously and would urge residents to be respectful.

It has been reported that Parachutists from Sibson Airfield are landing off course and frightening Dogs, Horses, and residents. Cars are being driven over private land to recover "strays". A letter will be sent reminding the Airfield that they should attend to the safety the Parachutists, Residents and Animals.

Hi all,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank those of you who voted for me in the recent election, and to extend a hand of friendship to those who didn't – I know have 3 years to demonstrate why you should next time!

It has been a frantic couple of months since the election, I have attended seven of the eight parish council meetings held since the election and it is my intention to continue this and attend as many as I can. Parish councils are hugely important, and I am looking to work with all four as collaboratively as possible. I have also had a series of meetings in my new capacity of Chair of Adults and Health Scrutiny Committee. This along with full council and officer meetings, I have been busy.

This week, I spent an afternoon with the Managers of Aragon Services Ltd, conducting a Ward Walk, whereby we visited all five villages, looking at improvements that can be made to the waste and street -scene offering. Thanks to all four Parish Councils, who all put forward areas they wanted looking at. Ewe covered them all and Aragon are responding to them all, so I will report back.

- I have attended several meetings on behalf of and with the residents of Upton with Highways England, in relation to the A47 upgrade and the impact this proposed scheme will have on them. Equally, I have been working for the residents in Wansford to try and get some sense around both roundabouts at the A1-A47 interchange.
- I have represented the residents of Sutton at a planning committee and together we secured the decision they wanted. I have also pushed for and seen new white lines painted in the village.
- I have taken responsibility for pushing forward and forming a project group do build an evidence base and submission, for the proposed flyover at Wittering. I also continue to push for a satisfactory solution to the proposed 61 forced evictions in Wittering and we are making progress.

• I have assisted residents with issues over driveways and disabled access, replacement green bins and food caddies, planning matters, fly-tipping, and better access to services.

Now that we are returning to some form of "normal", I will be looking to host a monthly surgery, so once this is in place, I will let you all know. I am also happy to get involved in any initiatives such as litter picks or community action days, so if you know of any, please let me know.


