

I'm writing this in the middle of July, with the grain lorries rumbling past the vicarage in Nassington as the harvest begins. There certainly seems to be a lot

of activity in the fields at the moment before the forecast high temperatures. Something I always notice at this time of year is the occasional scattering of grain at a road junction where it seems as though a loaded grain lorry has lost a little of its cargo as the trailer negotiated the corner. Just like the straw we see on the side of the road when the bales are transported later, the grain reminds me of the work going on around us, and I find that this prompts me to prayer; prayer for the those who have harvested the grain I see, for those transporting it and for those who will benefit from the work of others in terms of food provided. So much of what we see around us can prompt us to prayer and reflection if we open the eyes of our hearts and minds.

Today's women working for tomorrow's world

Presentation given by Lucy Lewis, The Uk's First Female Bomb Disposal Expert



Stibbington & Wansford Women's Institute welcomed a very different presenter to its monthly meeting on Tuesday, 12 July 2022. Previous WI presentations on subjects such as beekeeping, designing knitting patterns and cultivating blueberries entered a whole new genre with a talk given by Lucy Lewis, the UK's first female bomb disposal expert. Given that WI presentations aim to educate, you may wonder if the subject of bomb disposal was likely to be of use to her audience but, after listening to the presentation, perhaps the main lesson to be learned from Lucy was that a self-disciplined and focused mind can do anything.

Lucy's bomb disposal days were just over 20 years ago but the publication of her book `Lighting the Fuse' published by Orion in 2021 has led her to present to groups those years of her life when her work in bomb disposal could be compared to a scary game of `Russian roulette' and, in her words, she was lucky. I note that her book is not only dedicated to her family but also to a colleague who was not so lucky and whose life ended at the age of 29.

The path that took her there was clearly a sense of adventure which developed through her time travelling around South America, sailing up the Amazon and then embarking upon a 2-year voyage around the world in a tall ship, the Zebu, with Operation Raleigh during which time Lucy never quite developed sea legs and was constantly nauseous. After that, life back in the UK seemed rather dull working in airport security and so, after a stint with the Territorial Army in 1988, Lucy rather incredulously (her word) found herself arriving at Sandhurst for officer cadet training after being selected as one of 48 women in her year alongside 380 men. Lucy gave an account of her time at Sandhurst with hilarious stories of how she and her fellow officer cadets survived the training college's formal dinners where the high jinks of all ranks were the order of the day, presumably designed to test creativity and resilience, as well as her disasters in learning how to use a gun as their standard provision of a Browning 9mm pistol is designed to accommodate a larger, man's hand. She was also able to get through a total of 7 ironing boards during her

time there because of the Army's stringent rules on officer uniforms with the expectation to have impeccably ironed shirts, skirts and trousers. Lucy went on to learn how to defuse and wire mines, defuse bombs, deal with chemical weapons, how best to cross a minefield (by crawling through it rather than round it), blow up bridges, and how to wire a fridge for maximum effect on opening its door (I liked her up to that point!).

Lucy went on to serve with the Women's Royal Army Corps and the Royal Military Police. She served in Northern Ireland (her most challenging time), Cyprus, Germany, the UK and also worked in Jordan on a special project for the Jordanian Royal Family. Her talk referenced the many bombs that remain deep under cover in London and explained that the complexity of bombs today is more challenging than those of WW1 and WW2 when they were conveniently coded on their casing and easier to identify.

Life after bomb disposal has led Lucy to be appointed Cambridge University Marshall in 2018, and she was the first women to hold the role since it was established on 7 December 1620. Part of the role of the University Marshall is to participate in Cambridge University graduation ceremonies and to carry a 400-year-old mace. In her words, Lucy describes the ceremonies as a piece of theatre which is



conducted entirely in Latin. It sounds a world away from her days in bomb disposal with the risks that she and her colleagues were trained and willing to take. In her book's acknowledgements Lucy thanked the Zebu, the tall ship that took her round the world, and her fellow venturers who sparked something in her all those years ago teaching her that she was capable of more. Well done, Lucy - and thank you for coming to Wansford!



Wansford Parish Council met on 11 July 2022, 6 councillors and the Parish Clerk were present



The following items were discussed: -

Minutes of previous meeting approved

A47 Dualling

WPC have now submitted all WPC's responses to the Planning Inspectorate Enquiry for the scheme., The inspector will publish his decision by 11 October 2022.

Telephone Kiosk with Defibrillator

The more observant of you may have noticed that members of WPC have fully redecorated our telephone kiosk, which should keep it smart for some time to come. A considerable effort was required to bring it back to the high standard you see. A nearby resident was also a huge help.

Old Leicester Road HGV's

WPC are investigating if a 7.5T limit could be imposed on this road to stop HGV's cutting through the village when there is an alternative route.

Planning.

A retrospective Planning application has been made in respect of the two metre high fence on the corner of Peterborough Road. Any fence on the highway boundary over one metre high requires planning permission. WPC's view is that the decision should follow Peterborough City Council's approach in such a prominent position in a Conservation area.

In the Yarwell area a planning appeal has been submitted to extract gravel near the Yarwell Mill development for use on an associated farm. WPC are against this appeal on increased Traffic grounds and concerns over its future use.

Accounts

The accounts and planned expenditure were approved.

Wansford picnic site

PCC are being requested to ask Aragon Contractors to collect the bagged rubbish, which is apparently not in their contract!

A47 west and A1 roadworks.

WPC are to express their concern to National Highways that traffic noise in the next months when the A1 may be closed at night will affect adjoining homes. Particularly due noise created by traffic driving over potholes.

Sutton Station and A47

WPC supports Sutton PC proposal to resite the old historic Sutton Railway Station to south of the A47. It is due to be demolished by the planned dualling, rather than parts only to be moved to Peterborough.

Trees blocking footpaths

Will all owners of trees that are overhanging footpaths please trim them back to a 2.2 metre headroom. If PCC contractors carry out this work the owner can expect an expensive bill!

Date of Next Meeting - The next meeting of Thornhaugh Parish Council will take place at 7.00 pm on 19th September 2022 in St Andrew's Church.

SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met at The Christie Hall on Thursday 7th July 2022 – 6 Councillors, Parish Clerk and 6 members of the public were in attendance.

During the Public Forum the following issues were raised -

Yellow Lines – CIIr Beuttell has been back in touch with Karen Lunn (hold up from Nene Valley Railway) going back out to public consultation – CIIr Beuttell stated needs to be done ASAP – follow up in couple weeks' time.

Double yellow lines on bridge - Cllrs Beuttell and Bradshaw to look at feasibility.

More bollards were requested to be placed along Old Great North Road.

Workshop - Change of Use of buildings next to Nene Valley Railway is going to appeal, and the date is yet to be announced.

Resident reported dreadful state of road when come past Café, potholes, lorry side road tarmac peeling back.

Roman Drive at Church Lane slip road coming over A1 by Café - Lorry overspill. The PC has been informed that Lorry Drivers do have access to services but do not have access to Café

Large transporters approx. 4 a day opposite old car wash i.e. slip road and doubling back – blocking entrance – needs to be signage at Breakers Yard – Cllr Beuttell will request signage.

More signs needed leaving Café North and South – cannot see signs that are there for overgrown trees. PC will find out who is responsible for maintaining trees.


