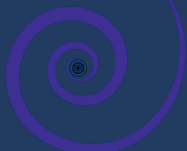

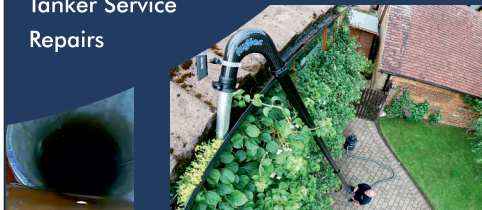

Today's women working for tomorrow's world

Hot off the press: our annual coffee morning in support of Macmillan will be on 28th September 2024. More details in the next magazine.



This month we invited Phillip Ecclestone to talk to us about his adventures to China, trying to introduce 21st Century farming practices and technology.

While working for British Sugar (AB Sugar), the company expanded across the world. China was very keen to embrace western approaches to sugar farming and processing. Phillip and a team went to work in China, to support this change in farming. The south was where sugar cane was grown, and the north where Phillip was based, it was sugar beet.

The northern farms and factories were based very close to the Siberian border. This gave rise to extreme weather conditions, with long, dry winters down to -40oC, the factory only able to work from September to January each year, and all harvesting to be completed before winter set in.

Phillip and his team, worked alongside the factory teams, as well as farmers, training them how to use the kit that been brought out to the local area. Also the farmers that had been growing sugar beet using their own equipment, were trained to farm using this equipment that was designed for western farms. Chinese farms have farmers working on narrow strips of land, whereas the equipment brought in was designed to work in much larger block fields. This is when a large amount of time was taken by Phillip and his team to build up relationships with both factory staff and farmers to embrace this new way of working.

It was interesting to see, how the introduction of a completely new methodology can look simple on paper, but for it to work will take a long time to become productive, with close support and understanding of different cultures and ways of working

Wansford Parish Council met on Monday, the 8th of July in the community hall and co-opted a new councilor Patricia Stuart-Mogg. This brings us up to full strength.

Members of the public came to discuss parking in Nene close. The garage area was investigated by Cross Keys Homes but apparently, they are all rented out at the minute so there's no possibility of using this area for extra parking in the immediate future. The main alternative currently, is to have grass-crete on part of the grass area. This will enable more cars, but some spaces will be lost to ensure access. We continue to work with Peterborough City Council to develop a plan and continue to pursue various possible funding streams for the work.

The National Highways designated fund was discussed asking for:

- Sound improvements along the A47
- Width restrictions over the bridge to stop heavy vehicles
- Help with the cost of parking modifications in Nene Close

The Defibrillators have been wired up and are completed and one of them was recently taken to a patient as precaution but not used.

The new clerk is settling well into her post with training courses later this month.

The local plans for Peterborough, North Northamptonshire and Huntingdonshire District Council were discussed and we felt this was best pursued with all the neighboring villages so we are hosting a session where all parties will get together to appraise the whole area.

There is a repeat appeal hearing about Seeds Field as the original appeal was set aside by a judicial review. The hearings will take place in Wansford community hall on the 16th and 17th of July between 10 and 4 each day. Anyone is allowed to attend but you can only speak when invited by the Inspector. It is certainly worth being there at the beginning when the ground rules are set. To remind everyone, this is to discuss a proposal for 14 self-build houses on the land to the west of Robins Field and Robinswood. The development is outside the village envelope and so was rejected by the Peterborough City Council planners.

The accounts were approved for last financial year and no changes to the budget are needed.

We are in correspondence with National Highways and writing a strong letter as they never keep us up to date of what's happening with the progress of the A47 dualling. We do hear about road closures, but nothing else. Two dates for the information on the archaeology have already been and gone so we feel it's wrong for the community to be kept in the dark on these matters. The Nene way has been closed under the A1 since January citing danger from site traffic and instead walkers are expected to walk across the main carriageways of the A1, even though no site traffic is flowing.

The mobile phone signal in Wansford is still very poor and we would encourage anyone who is experiencing difficulties to write to their provider by the middle of August. The parish Council will also write a letter as in some instances around the defibrillator site, there is no signal, which could be off-putting for people in an emergency. The more people who write to complain over a short period of time will be more likely to get a positive response for our village.

Wansford Parish Council has just been told by National Highways that they have cancelled the Galliford Try contract on the A47 Dualling and that they are going to re-tender the project. This will cause a significant delay and the existing construction compound will be removed. Apparently National Highways think that they can save money by doing this but, as we all know, the real way to save money is to move the road away from the slope down to the river Nene.

Wansford Parish Council is pressing National Highways to re-open the Nene Way footpath as soon as possible, there being no reason to keep it closed.

NEWS FROM WANSFORD AND KINGS CLIFFE PRACTICE

INFLUENZA PROTECTION

Yes, we have been planning our flu campaign for months!

IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE WE HAVE ALREADY PURCHASED A VACCINE FOR YOU. Please do not go elsewhere as last year we had 483 unused vaccines at a cost of c£5k. We ordered these vaccines based on eligibility.

Based on the evidence that flu vaccine's effectiveness can wane over time in adults JCVI have advised not to start the programme for most adults until the beginning of October.

Benefits of having a flu jab:

- Protection: The flu vaccine is designed to provide protection against common strains of the flu virus, reducing your risk of getting sick.
- Reduced Severity: If you do contract the flu after vaccination, it's often less severe, with milder symptoms and a shorter duration. You may not experience any symptoms at all.
- Community Immunity: By getting vaccinated, you contribute to herd immunity, which helps protect those who are more vulnerable to the flu, such as infants, the elderly, pregnant women, and individuals with weak immune systems.
- Lower Healthcare Burden: Widespread flu vaccination reduces the strain on healthcare systems, ensuring that medical resources are available for those who need them most.
- Yearly Protection: Since the flu virus can change each year, getting vaccinated annually ensures you're protected against the most current strains.

In addition, from September, we will be offering the new RSV vaccination to patients who turn 75 years of age on or after 1.9.2024. It is also being offered to pregnant ladies to offer protection to the unborn child. Again, invitations will be sent in the autumn.

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is a common respiratory virus that infects the nose, throat, lungs, and breathing passages. RSV spreads through contact with respiratory droplets (coughing, sneezing, or kissing) from an infected person or touching surfaces contaminated with the virus and then touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. RSV can survive for many hours on hard surfaces such as tables and crib rails. The virus typically lives on soft surfaces such as tissues and hands for shorter amounts of time. Children are often exposed to RSV outside the home, in school or nurseries. They can then transmit the virus to other members of the family.

RSV is so common that almost all children will have had an RSV infection by their 2nd birthday. RSV can be serious and can lead to severe illness among both children and certain adults. While certain groups including premature and very young infants (≤ 6 months), individuals with chronic heart or lung disease, immunocompromised individuals, and adults age 60 years and older, are at increased risk for severe disease, the potential for dangerous complications is a concern for all age groups. In fact, 80% of children younger than age 2 years who are hospitalised for an RSV illness do not have risk factors.



SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on the 11th July. There was one apology and 5 councillors attended. There were no declarations of interest declared.

Mrs. Hull pointed out that she had been cutting the hedgerows which were really overgrown, and it was agreed to pay her for this work. Other overgrown hedges were discussed, and it was agreed that the Chair and Vice Chair would investigate to ascertain who is responsible for the upkeep of those hedgerows. It was also pointed out that lorries are continuing to park along the outside of Stibbington Café. The PC will bring this to the attention of the new Café owner. A lack of 30 MPH along the slip road from the A1 slip road into the village. We will contact our local Highways Officer to discuss. It was also brought to our attention that there is an awful lot of "dog Poo" being left along the path to the sewage works and beyond. We would remind both residents and villagers that there is £1000 fine for dog fouling. More Dog Foul Bins will be ordered to try and alleviate the problem. There was a report of loose chickens along Elton Road.

Cambridge County Council will be contacted regarding the state of the grass verges along Old North Road, where a resident recently tripped and broke her ankle

The minutes of the meeting were duly agreed and signed together with the Annual Accounts for 2023/2024.

Several payments were agreed.

Our local Highways Officer recently visited and the Pot Holes along Elton Road have been repaired. The PC has agreed to paying for the replacement of the white lines in the village, and a quote will be asked for to see if this is feasible. It was also agreed to get a quote for the repair of the wall at the Bridge which has been broken for some time and is an absolute eyesore in the Village.

The Parish Council would like to thank Mrs. Elin Styles, for the wonderful poppies that she created and attached to our Tommies, which were placed in the village in memory of the fallen on D.Day.

The date of our next meeting is the **5th September, 2024**. I would also like to thank Sam Bradshaw for taking the minutes of the meeting.

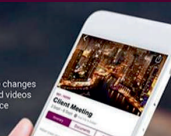
