#### Footpath Safety Old Leicester Road, Wansford

Because animals are being grazed in the Wansford Pastures at present, the Wildlife Trust has locked the permissive footpath gate, meaning that walkers wanting to go up to Sulehay Woods have to go to the official Public Footpath entrance at the junction of Old Leicester Road and Kings Cliffe Road. If you stay on the footpath on the north side of Old Leicester Road, heading west, you have to cross the road right on the junction and this can be guite hazardous.

To try and make this safer, Wansford Parish Council has cut back the undergrowth on the south side of Old Leicester Road between the Pastures gate and the Public Footpath. The route is shown in red on the attached Google Earth image.

The walking area is approximately 2m wide and it is difficult to make it wider as the ground falls away quite steeply in places. The idea is that people can cross the road at the Pastures gate and then walk along to the Public Footpath in safety. The area has not been surfaced in any way but it drains well and, if plenty of people use it, the brambles should be kept at bay.

#### SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Sibson-cum-Stibbington Parish Council met on Thursday the 4th November.

The meeting was held under strict Covid 19 Conditions.

Councillors present – M. Beuttell, I. Turner, M. Riddington, E. Engel, J. Wright Parish Clerk – Wendy Gray.

Apologies received from Cllr. M. Bradshaw.

There was 1 Declaration of interest from Cllr. J. Wright (Item 8) – Larkfleet forthcoming proposal for building of Houses. No Application in process or details yet received.

The minutes if the PC meeting held on the 2nd September, were approved and duly signed.

All payments were approved and duly signed off. Parish Clerk, Grass cutting, and Dog bins.

There were 3 planning applications discussed. 21/02401/HHFUL Proposed domestic garage at 21 Church Lane Stibbington – No objections raised.

20/01575/LDE - Application withdrawn

21/02054/S73 – PC objected to this application for planning in retrospect.

Newlands industrial site Proposal. All neighbouring PC's attended an exhibition held at Elton Hall. All neighbouring PC's are totally against this proposal, and residents are recommended to write to their MP Shailash Vara to register their objections.

Queens Platinum Jubilee – How should we celebrate – recommendations would be welcome.

There was correspondence from a resident complaining of the odour created by the spreading of slurry on adjoining fields in the Parish. The Farmer involved has given assurances regarding this.

There is a missing sign on Church Lane, which has been reported to Highways The double Yellow lines along Old Great North Road are due to be installed. NVR have been contacted regarding this.

Cllr. Bradshaw forwarded a report from the Christie Hall Management Committee.

Questions were raised regarding the absence of Remembrance Day poppies and decoration in Stibbington Village – This will be addressed.

The absence of the village sign on entry to Wansford was again discussed and a new sign will be forthcoming. There was also a discussion regarding potholes, which has been reported. It was observed the HDC sent a street sweeper to the village recently. The local traffic sign on the Flyover from the A1 to Stibbington has still not been repaired and it has again been reported to Highways.

The date of the next PC meeting will be held on the 6th January, 2022 in the Christie Hall.

#### **WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL**



Wansford Parish Council met in the Community Hall on the 8th November with all Councillors present.





The great news is that Wansford Parish Council has a new Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer (RFO). Marie Lewis has bravely taken up the job and is rapidly finding her way around the Council's business. Marie has been a resident of the village since 1990 and is well known for editing the Nene Bridge WI Times. She is a very experienced administrator and will no doubt keep the Councillors on the straight and narrow. One of her early tasks will be to bring the Parish Council web site www.wansfordvillage.com up to date as it has fallen into disuse in the last few months with no clerk in place. #### Good Neighbours - Rural Peterborough

The meeting started with a presentation by Neil Boyce and Cate Harding about the Good Neighbours - Rural Peterborough organisation. This charity has been set up to expand the area covered by a scheme that has been running in Castor for a while. The charity aims to co-ordinate volunteers to help people in need in the rural community with transport to medical appointments, light gardening, some DIY tasks and other general support. The role of the charity is to match those in need with the volunteers while dealing with safeguarding issues, insurance and the like. Through Cate's links with Peterborough City Council, the charity can also co-ordinate with social services, adult social care and the doctors' surgeries. More details can be found at Home - Good Neighbours (goodneighboursrp.org.uk).

#### **Peterborough Road Wall**

The Council has been in touch with PCC about the state of the stone wall on the north side of Peterborough Road. The capping stones have been removed in one place close to the play area and the whole wall is heavily overgrown with ivy which is pulling the mortar out from between the stones. PCC own this wall and hopefully will deal with the problems fairly quickly to avoid further damage.

#### **Planning**

The Council considered 3 planning applications:-

The applications to reduce the size of trees at 2 Yarwell Road and build an extension at the back of 8 Swanhill both presented no problems.

The application for approval of reserved matters in relation to the construction of a house on land adjacent to 27 Nene Close (the wooden garages site) was more contentious. The Council has asked PCC to ensure that the window positions and types are clearly defined in any approval to ensure that the neighbours' privacy is not compromised. The plans submitted show the path linking Nene Close and Peterborough Road via the Community Hall being retained for public access. The Council asked for the retention of this path to be made a condition of the approval.

#### Tree Planting on the Green Space in Nene Close

PCC have written to Wansford Parish Council saying that they intend to plant 5 new trees of an unspecified variety on the green area opposite the houses on Nene Close. The exact location of these trees is not given. WPC have responded that this scale of tree cover would not be welcome but the planting of a single oak to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, in a location agree with the residents, would be more suitable. Gavin Elsey, our City Councillor, supports this approach. We await further developments.

#### Road Signs in the Village

Following the declassification of the A6118 to become the C340, PCC has agreed to work with the Parish Council to remove the existing decaying direction signs around the main cross roads in the village and replace them with traditional cast iron finger post signs. The signs have been ordered.

#### **A47 Picnic Site River Sports Facility**

Following meetings with Wansford Parish Council, Sacrewell has agreed to pursue the creation of a river sports centre on the land to the south of the disused A47 picnic site. The picnic site is in use at present as a working area for developments on the A47 and will remain in this use for several years. This will give time to prepare plans and finance for the river sports facility.

#### **Budget**

The Parish Council agreed to hold an Extraordinary Meeting to discuss the Parish Council budget for 2022-23 well before the annuary deadline.

The next WPC meeting is on 13th December 2021 at 7.30pm in the Community Hall and you are most welcome to come along. The agenda will be published on the Council noticeboard and web site at least 4 days before the meeting.

A meeting of Thornhaugh Parish Council took place on 15th November 2021 in St Andrew's Church. It was chaired by Chris Smith and present were Ashleigh Kewney, Louise Molesworth and Adrian Rodgers. In attendance was one Member of the Public. Apologies were given from Martin Lewis, Deirdre McCumiskey, Hannah Joyce and Gavin Elsey, Peterborough City Ward Councillor.

#### **Public Forum**

Camilla Plumb introduced herself, having purchased a house in the village recently. She brought with her some of the proposed plans/ideas they have for renovating the house to allay any concerns that residents might have about major building work. She has also volunteered her support for the Jubilee Event next year. Hannah Joyce sent apologies for not being able to attend the meeting but wanted to volunteer her support for the Jubilee Event.

#### Defibrillator

The following people so far have confirmed interest in the training. Lawrence Hall, Diane Dunlop, Nikki Higgins and Stuart Foreman. Anecdotally others have confirmed to Louise Molesworth that they are interested. Louise will remind people at the Christmas Tree Event to sign up formally so we can assess numbers. The training will likely be held in the Christie Hall.

#### **Footpaths**

Contact made with Lindsey Freeman who confirmed she is happy in principle to support a Footpaths' Group to help manage issues. Her thoughts were that the group would cover more than Thornhaugh as part of a wider remit. We have yet to discuss this further with Lindsey, however Peterborough City Council (PCC) will not provide landowners' names and contact addresses so once Lindsey is free to talk further, we can work out how to get that data and how a Footpaths' Group would work.

#### Living Villages

The November Edition confirmed that a new editorial team had been found to take over the magazine, so we won't have to say goodbye. Our thanks go to the whole Living Villages' team for their support over so many years and we welcome the continuity that the new Editor Craig Bunday, will bring.

#### **Hanging Baskets**

Autumn baskets are in place. The old summer baskets have had to be left on the verge under the new ones because PCC are not collecting garden waste until January. If anyone can dispose of them before then the Thornhaugh PC would be grateful, if not they will go in January when the PCC has advised garden waste services should resume.

#### **Christmas Event**

The tree once again has been kindly funded by the Bill Rogers' Memorial Fund. Nicky Rogers has produced a flyer and will distribute in due course. The Event is scheduled for 6pm on 12th December 2021 at the triangle on Meadow Lane and the carols will be accompanied by the Wansford Ukulele Group.

#### Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Louise Molesworth is leading on the event for the Parish Council, but she can't do it alone. Alongside other Councilors, so far offers of support have come from Joan and Alan Frost, Hannah Joyce and Camilla Plumb. Please let Louise or Deirdre know if you can help and have ideas on what sort of event you might like to have.

#### **Finance**

Adrian Rogers confirmed that all was on track with the funds. The second part of the precept has been received and we are still on track to have around  $\pounds 4k$  in funds at the end of the year. It was agreed that a discussion relating to the setting of an appropriate level of reserves be added to the agenda for the next meeting.

#### **Internet Banking**

It was agreed that changes in the operational management of the bank account with Barclays were not necessary since a policy relating to Financial Management is already in place. Adrian Rogers will once again approach Barclays regarding electronic access to the account for him to provide backup for the Clerk.

#### **Insurance**

Annual insurance renewed with new provider. 3-year deal in place. Insurance covers any volunteers

working on behalf of the Parish Council (eg litter pickers).

#### **Planning Applications**

21/01012 - Front porch & garage extension converting existing garage into home office including dormer window at 5 Home Farm Cottages, Leicester Road, Thornhaugh – Approved; 21/00873 Replacement of 3 metal windows on front elevation and 2 metal windows on rear elevation at Browetts Cottage, 6 Russell Hill, Thornhaugh – Approved; 21/01225 - Construction of a first-floor loft conversion above an existing garage at St Medard House, Russell Hill, Thornhaugh – Awaiting decision

#### **Road Closures**

A complaint has been lodged regarding the problem caused by PCC in closing both the A1 and the A47 entrances at the same time, with neither contractor aware of the other works taking place. An e-mail has been received from Peter Tebb of PCC with apologies for the confusion caused by the emergency works. He has acknowledged that more should have been done to inform residents and better communication between the two contractors about an escort service through the A47 works to allow residents to access the village. He is committed to ensuring this does not happen again.

#### **Memorial Wreath**

A donation was made by Chris Smith to purchase a Poppy Wreath on behalf of the Parish Council. In the event Stuart Foreman placed a previously purchased wreath on the memorial in order that more of the donation money would go to the British Legion.

#### **Garden Waste**

An exchange of emails has taken place with PCC regarding the withdrawal of garden waste collections at a key time of the year without them offering an alternative solution. Despite asking twice they have not taken on board the difficulties caused and are blaming the lack of drivers and the fact that HGV training has a major backlog. There would appear to be nothing more that they are prepared to do. Residents are still awaiting their refunds for the withdrawn service.

#### Pumpkin

Grateful thanks to whoever disposed of the pumpkin at the end of Meadow Lane.

#### **Parish Council Elections**

Parish Council Elections are due to be held in May next year. It was agreed that this will be an agenda item for the next meeting in January to manage the election process appropriately to ensure continuity.

#### Peterborough City Council Land Transfer

It has been reported that Peterborough City Council has transferred ownership of the turning area in Meadow Lane without following any form of consultation with residents or due process. The Parish Council has concerns about the way Peterborough City Council has handled this and what the repercussions might be both for Meadow Lane residents in terms of the loss of an amenity (turning space for cars, emergency vehicles, etc) that has been in place for many years and what precedent this might set for any other areas of City Council/Highways land. It was agreed that the Chairman would write to PCC to seek an explanation about why due process was not followed, and to seek confirmation of what conditions were attached to the transfer such that the space can continue to be used by residents as it has been for a significant period.

#### Speeding

There is still a lot of speeding through the village, on many occasions from residents themselves not people passing through. Next Newsletter to ask for support to commit to the speed limits in the village – as a reminder this is 20mph in the village itself, 40mph on the approach from the A47 to the outskirts of the village. Speed signs are in place.

#### Memorial

It was noted that the Parish Council would like to do something to commemorate Hubert Warren's services to the village following his sad passing. Louise Molesworth confirmed that she will also discuss this with the Burial Ground Committee to ensure no duplication.


