Don't be tempted to fall in love at first swipe this Valentine's season

FEBRUARY is the season of love and romance – but it is also a key date for fraudsters aiming to steal your money as well as your heart. According to statistics from Action Fraud, reports of romance fraud have increased by 40 per cent in the year to April 2021.

Dating online without meeting in person has become the new normal throughout the coronavirus pandemic.

However, fraudsters have duped those looking for love out of an estimated £73.9m during this period, with Action Fraud receiving 7,754 reports.

Sadly, due to many victims feeling too embarrassed or upset to tell the authorities, this figure is likely to be much higher.

Some seven million UK residents are believed to be registered on dating sites, with Tinder taking the lion's share of the market when it comes to online dating apps.

However, while for many it may be romance and roses; for countless others it can spiral into heart break and financial misery when looking for love at first swipe.

Fraudsters trick victims into sending money or gather enough personal information to steal their identities, resulting in financial and emotional misery.

The majority of accounts on dating websites are genuine people looking for romance or companionship, but fraudsters may try to contact you by making fake profiles, getting in touch and building what feels like a loving relationship.

Once a fraudster using a fake dating profile is confident that they've won your trust, they will tell you about a problem they're experiencing and ask you to help out by sending money. They may have arranged to visit you but need money to pay for the flight or visa. They may tell you everything has been booked but their ticket has been stolen, and you need to send money quickly to get them on the next flight.

Alternatively, they may prey on your sympathies, telling you a family member or someone else they are responsible for is ill and they need money for medical treatment.

Once you send them money, the fraudsters will keep coming back and invent new reasons to send them more.

There are a few simple steps to keep yourself, and your loved ones, safe:

- **D** Don't rush into an online relationship. Get to know the person, not the profile, ensuring you ask plenty of questions. The vast majority of romance fraud is initiated online.
- **A** Analyse their profile. Protect yourself by confirming their identity. Check the person is genuine by putting the following into your search engine: their name, profile picture (by simply using a reverse image search) and any repeatedly used phrases, along with the term 'dating scam'.
- **T** Talk to your friends and family. Be wary of anyone who tells you not to tell others about them. Romance fraud involves grooming over a long period of time. Alienating a victim from their friends and family can make up part of that process.
- **E** Evade scams. Never send money or share your bank details with someone you've only met online. it doesn't matter how long you've been speaking to them or what story they give behind needing the sum.
- **S** Stay on the dating site messenger service. Fraudsters will often encourage their victims to use different communications channels that are often undetectable. Be confident that you know who you are speaking to and be wary if they fail to meet you in person.

REFLECTIONS by Rev. Jane Tailby

I suppose all the Christmas decorations are safely away by now; after all you are reading this in February! Even so, in the Church, the Christmas/Epiphany season only really ends on 2nd February, when we remember the story of when the young child Jesus was brought to the Temple in Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph, and two faithful people, Simeon and Anna recognised this child as the long-awaited Messiah, the Light of the World. The day is called Candlemas, as on this day, traditionally, the candles for use during the year, were blessed.

On this day, or the nearest Sunday, we hold a special Candlemas service. This year the service is on 30th January you might be in time to join us at Nassington Church at 10 am that day. During the service we light candles, remembering that Jesus is the Light of the World, and after special prayers we blow out the candles, reminding ourselves that although we extinguish our candles to mark the end of the Christmas/Epiphany season, the Light of Christ is never extinguished. As we hear on Christmas Day, "the light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it. Also during this service we reflect on turning away now from the Crib to the Cross, as we are not that far away from Lent.

For me that reminds me that the new year isn't just about trying to turn away from what is wrong, to set new resolutions, but also to consider how we are sometimes called to leave behind good things as out life changes and moves on. Perhaps this might be a change of home or job, moving from education to employment, or retirement, or moving nearer family, or perhaps into more sheltered accommodation. We face many changes in our lives when we find we are moving from good things to something new. That isn't always easy – staying with the wonderfully comforting Christmas stories might feel easier than preparing to hear again the stories of Jesus' self-giving on the Cross. However, we are called to discover new things, to venture on, taking with us what we have learned that strengthens us for new challenges. Whatever the rest of this year holds for you, may you know the Light of Jesus guiding you and comforting you.

STIBBINGTON & WANSFORD WI

Today's women working for tomorrow's world





Stibbington and Wansford Women's Institute welcomed Claudine Garner and Andrea Togher to their monthly meeting on Tuesday, 11 January 2022. Claudine and Andrea are members of the Nene Coppicing and Crafts voluntary group who are dedicated to promoting heritage woodland skills, conservation and crafts. Their presentation showed the work of the group at Sacrewell Farm and Castor Hanglands, near Upton. They also work at Ferry Meadows and Grimshaw Wood, Bretton. Andrea told us that there are currently 30 members within the group and new members are always welcome but anyone wishing to visit their sites to see their work is also welcome. They can be found at Sacrewell Farm on a Wednesday next to the blacksmith and the gin and chocolate

makers! There you will find them demonstrating how to weave willow,


weave peg loom rugs and make wooden stools. They encourage visitors to make something such as wicker garlands for decoration and quoits to throw, and their children's wands made from willow with a star shape at the end have proven to be very popular. Sacrewell Farm is currently developing a sensory garden and their volunteers are busy weaving willow fencing as well as weaving hedgerows. They have also built their own outdoor shelter at Sacrewell to store willow which must be stored outside for 6 to 8 weeks to dry and then soaked overnight before it can be used for weaving.

Claudine spoke about Castor Hanglands and its woodland management. Coppicing takes place in the colder months to prepare for new growth in the spring and summer. A tool called a bill hook is used in the coppicing process. The wood collected from coppicing is burned in kilns during the summer to make

charcoal and some members of the group camp out overnight during this time in order to keep the kilns burning. Their charcoal is sold at Willowbrook Farm, Mould (the Nassington butcher) and in Stamford Garden Centre for £7.50 a bag. They also make artists' charcoal sticks. Claudine grew up in France and, interestingly, she has found a word in the English woodland skills vocabulary - faggot - which she claimed is of

French origin, a faggot being a bundle of long branches bound together as fire wood. Claudine and Andrea brought with them a selection of their many crafted items such as wicker baskets, whittled wooden spoons (one particularly interesting carved hazel spoon), Christmas decorations woven in the shape of a Christmas tree and a star, some of which can be seen in the photographs displayed here.

This was the first of the WI's presentations for 2022 and there are many more such interesting talks planned in the coming months from the experiences of a bomb disposal expert to a beekeeper!

A47 Wansford to Sutton Dualling Update - January 2022

The Planning Inspector has now made serious progress with his review of the National Highways (the new name for Highways England) DCO Application (effectively the planning application) for the A47 Wansford to Sutton Dualling. The work by the Planning Inspector has been very impressive with questions being asked of National Highways in most of the areas that Wansford and Sutton Parish Councils have been asking for several years. In particular he has asked National Highways to demonstrate how the Wansford western roundabout will perform with its increased traffic load and how the scheme achieves a balance between risks to heritage assets and nature conservation.

Online hearings were held using Teams on the 11th and 12th January to discuss the procedures for completing the review and the wording of the draft DCO order. Both meetings were attended by National Highways and representatives of the Sutton, Wansford and Upton communities. It was rather disappointing that Peterborough City Council chose not to join in the discussions.

Following these meetings, the Planning Inspector has published a letter which sets out the detailed timetable and procedures for the rest of the examination. This can be found at

The timetable contains numerous deadlines and hearings through to mid-July 2022. Probably the easiest way to follow what is going on is to look at the Documents tab on the project page of the National Infrastructure Planning website at




