# Service of Thanksgiving at St.Mary's Church Wansford

The disappointing weather on Sunday 5th June did not dampen the enthusiasm for celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with a Service of Thanksgiving at St. Mary's Church Wansford. The singing was led by the Choir under the direction of Eddie McDonnell who performed Alleluia by William Boyce, Mozarts Jubilate arranged by Alan Bullard and the hymn While for All Mankind We Pray.

Specially written prayers for the occasion were said and appropriate hymns sung.

A novel feature was two members of the congregation giving their own personal recollections of the Queen's Coronation in June 1953.

The Service ended with the singing of two verses of the National Anthem.

A commemorative Rowan tree was then planted in the Churchyard by Churchwardens Caroline Ashley and Alan lones.



This was followed by Coffee and celebration cakes kindly provided by the Friend's of St Mary's and St Andrews.



# **WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL**

June has been a busy month for Wansford Parish Council. Although the Jubilee beacon lighting on the Thursday was well attended, the lunches organized for the Sunday were a bit of a damp squib with cold rain all day. Despite the rain, 35 hardy folks turned out for the Old North Road/Robins Field/ Robinswood gathering and a good time was had thanks to the shelter of a large marquee.

Those who are observant will have noticed that the finger post signs in the centre of Wansford have been modified to correct the mis-spelling of King's Cliffe. The new signs have improved the appearance of the area around the church and the next step is to get the remaining PCC signs straightened, replace the litter bins with wooden ones and remove several redundant bits of street furniture. There has been a suggestion to install a permanent village beacon near the Yarwell Road junction. Does anyone have any thoughts on this?

The telephone box (now defibrillator and book exchange) on Old North Road has been renovated. After a thorough wire brush and following a brief appearance in pink primer, the box is now resplendent in the familiar cherry red. Thank you to the team of residents who have helped with this.

Two of the councillors walked around the Wansford picnic site with a PCC representative and agreed a new arrangement for the litter bins. With the picnic site closed, the bins will be set out to be of use to people using the footpath under the A1. It would be useful if the person who throws an energy drink can onto the grass every day would put it in a bin instead!

The A47 upgrade review by the Planning Inspectorate is proceeding with the submissions for Deadline 8 now available. From these submissions it is clear that National Highways did not use the correct procedures when selecting the route of the new road in the area of the Scheduled Monument. The Inspector is also questioning the traffic modelling of the Wansford western roundabout. The Inspector is due to complete his examination by the 11th July with a decision by the Secretary of State for Transport at the end of the year.

The new external lighting for Wansford Church is now in place and working well. There was a small overrun of costs because of the need to protect the lights with cages but the whole cost has been covered by Wansford Parish Council. Many thanks to JMF Electrical who did this work at cost without labour charges.

Wansford Parish Council met on the 13th June with a very full 26 point agenda. The Chairman was unwell so the meeting was chaired by the Vice-Chairman. Full minutes are on the WPC web site www.wansford-pc.gov.uk.

Two planning applications within the village (a garden room at 21 Old North Road and minor modifications to the plans for 8 Robinswood) received no objections.

More contentious was an application to extend the Rockingham Forest Park by the addition of 80 new lodges and an amenity building. As happened when considering the initial development, a group of councillors visited the site to look at the new location and also to see whether the developer had done what they promised with the original cabins. The main concerns were the amount of traffic generated, the sewerage disposal arrangements and the impact on wildlife. It was clear from the visit that the existing park was being managed carefully and all the originally planned features had been incorporated. Check in and check out times cover quite a long period so there will be no pulse of traffic at weekends.

The existing lodges have their effluent treated in a package treatment works on site with the clean output being pumped to a local stream. Anglian Water have required the new development to pump its effluent to the King's Cliffe treatment works which is reported to have sufficient capacity. WPC have suggested in their response that there should be at least 24 hours effluent storage on site to address power cuts.

WPC have also asked that the layout of the lodges be changed slightly so that there is a gap between the original development and the new lodges. This will give wildlife a corridor so that they are not confronted with a continuous wall of development.

Councillors also discussed the heavy vehicle traffic from the King's Cliffe Industrial Estate. The signage at the estate exit has been much improved, warning trucks not to enter Wansford Village. The signage at the junction of Old Leicester Road and King's Cliffe Road will be modified to clearly show the correct route to the A1. WPC will discuss with PCC the option to put a 7.5T weight limit on trucks using Old Leicester Road past Robins Field.

The refreshed Wansford Parish Council web site is getting much more use than the old one and other parish councils seem to be using it as an information source.

We are still looking for someone to fill the vacant seat as a parish councillor. If you are interested, please contact the Parish Clerk.

At present the grassy area at Nene Close is the only publicly accessible open space in Wansford. The main part of this is mown grass and is used for ball games and other activities.

Six years ago, in the south of the area, the Parish Council built a children's playground which is fenced.

This year the Parish Council has planted an oak tree to celebrate the Royal Platinum Jubilee just to the west of the play area. This is thriving and is now in leaf.

To further enhance the space immediately around the play area, the Parish Council is considering clearing some of the brambles and allowing a range of wild flowers and grasses to grow. This will get away from the monoculture of just plain grass and provide food for a range of birds, butterflies and bees.

When the grass is allowed to grow out a little, the area already has snowdrops, daffodils and two or three other varieties of flowers.

The intention would be to plant a range of primroses as plugs and also sow a mix of wild flower seeds. The range of flowers would be developed over the next two years and to trigger this we would hold a planting day in the Autumn.

As part of allowing the wild flowers to grow, the mowing regime of the area would be changed so that the grass is always at least 100mm long and in late summer part of it would be allowed to get longer so that flowers can set seeds. The play



area and a path into it would continue to be mown as at present.

These plans have been discussed with Peterborough Environmental City Trust (PECT) and Peterborough City Council. PECT will be providing some of the plants and helping with the project. Do residents think that this is a good idea and if so would you be willing to help with the management of the area? # The diary of a parish council clerk



My last diary entry for you told the story of my challenges in setting up the parish council's new website (www.wansford-pc.gov.uk). This time, in complete contrast, I want to let you know of an old parish council book that has come to light and which contains a treasure trove of handwritten entries that bring to life the Wansford of many years ago.

The origins of parish councils date back to the Tudor period, but what we recognise today as parish councils really began as the result of the Local Government Act of 1894. Our treasured leather-bound book has handwritten records of Wansford parish meetings from that year (1894). Published by Knight & Company of 90 Fleet Street, London, its first pages set out the controlling procedures for parish meetings where a chairman is appointed each year with a group of overseers (now known as parish councillors) and where "all speakers must stand whilst addressing the chairman"! Perhaps a rule that should be reinstated! The book draws its reader into an environment which was very different to the Wansford of today, where in

March 1895 it records an annual parish budget (now known as the precept) of 11 shillings and 6 pence. Parish meetings were held in the reading room of a building we now know as Chapel Court.

The minutes of parish meetings held in March 1910 and April 1914 record issues with drainage - not the most interesting subject, you may think – but read on. The 1910 entry states that there was "a continued running of water across the Leicester Road (our Old Leicester Road) near Major Wickham's stable yard causing much inconvenience to traffic, especially cyclists during the frosty weather." "This has been caused by an overflowing drain which made a gutter across the road." A gutter in the road tells us that it was likely a long-term problem and also one which we would today regard as a health and safety issue. It also suggests that in 1910 there were more cyclists on the road than today and almost portrays a comedy of cyclists freewheeling down the hill and skidding on frozen drain water. Again, in April 1914 a drainage issue is noted when the parish meeting agreed "to ask the county authority to have drains installed to take away surface water from the roads from the crossroads to the top of the hill leading to Stamford, also the main road leading to Leicester". As we know, today's north end of Wansford village rarely has issues with drainage although these continue on the south side of the river in our neighbouring parish.

In May 1915 the parish meeting agreed that "in view of the present crisis (perhaps an understatement for WW1) it would be very convenient to have a finger post at the crossroads and Wansford Street indicating Stamford, Peterborough and London and the county authority would be asked to give this matter their attention." Pace does not seem to have been a priority in 1915 as the parish minutes of 8 November (some six months later) report that a letter was received from one Mr Deacon responding to the request for a finger post at the crossroads and that this matter would be considered. The parish council of today would expect a prompt response but at that time parish meetings were held only twice a year, surely a recipe for operating at a snail's pace whereas now our meetings are held each month.

At a parish meeting held in March 1919 a letter was read from the Mayor of Peterborough regarding plans for a War Memorial in connection with a new Infirmary in Peterborough. That Memorial Hospital, as it became known, was eventually opened by Field Marshall Sir William Robertson in 1928 as a living memorial to those of the city and the 6th Northamptonshire Regiment who died in WW1and was the beginning of Peterborough's health service amenities we see today.
