

## **Tough decisions for UK investors**

Forcing people to pay more tax on their hard-earned savings is not a popular policy for governments but it is something that UK investors face in the upcoming financial year after chancellor Jeremy Hunt confirmed a reduction to the capital gains allowance from April.

For investors, the most obvious effect on their savings is that any investment held outside an ISA or pension will be subject to capital gains tax.

• These tax hikes mean that owning assets outside of tax effective wrappers is getting more expensive. One option available to investors is the often overlooked 'Bed and ISA', which is when any savings held in a general investment account are transferred over to an ISA.

If you're planning to gift assets to someone else, then it could be worth making use of your annual CGT allowance this year before it's reduced.

Many people don't realise that you also owe capital gains tax on assets gifted to someone else.

## REFLECTIONS

I love this time of year when there seems to be an explosion of white and green across our landscapes. We will still be enjoying this freshness in June, I know. Also, at the end of May, in the church, our Easter season draws to an end with the celebrations of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, often still called Whit Sunday in our church calendar. In the church we have different colours to represent our different church seasons: Easter and Christmas are joyfully white, special celebrations of God's gift of the Holy Spirit are red, the more reflective preparation seasons of Advent and Lent are purple, and for everything else, it is green.

It's also an opportunity to give thanks for what has helped us in the past and to plan for the future. We are particularly grateful to those in our church community who help that growth and change - those who care for our church building, decorate and clean, who facilitate our worship, those who support us financially, and who make sure that the church is available for those who come to us for a baptism, a wedding or a funeral. This is indeed a time to say thank you to them and to note that their efforts, though often unseen are so important to our life together. More widely, maybe this is a time to consider who and what helps us to grow as individuals and families, and to make sure they know that we appreciate all they do. And we enjoy our wonderful countryside as well!





Wansford certainly knows how to party! The two parishes of Wansford and




Wansford's Coronation Picnic held on Sunday, 7 May 2023 was enjoyed by all and the warmth and sunshine that

part of the Picnic was the number of children whizzing around the field - where did they all come from? They enjoyed games of tag, made kings' and queens' crowns, participated in egg




and spoon and sack races and, later in the afternoon, the adults took part in a wheelbarrow race and tug o' war.




At one point in the afternoon two community police officers appeared and very quickly found the tea tent and spent time to meet and greet the community.



## **WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL**



The month of May certainly saw some spectacle with the Coronation Weekend being enjoyed by our village and beyond.

Wansford and Sibson cum Stibbington Parish Council's came together with the Haycock Manor Hotel for a Coronation Picnic that will be remembered by many, as I still remember Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation of 1953!

Now to Council matters.... Wansford Parish Council held three Meetings in May 2023, and you can find a full account of them in Minutes on our website <a href="https://www.wansford-pc.gov.uk">www.wansford-pc.gov.uk</a> and I will briefly give you an overview.

We started with the Annual Parish Meeting held on Thursday the 11th May and was to be our first meeting held on the Village Green, but alas the weather did not play ball, and we retreated for cover inside St Mary's Church. Nevertheless, many topics were discussed by residents, which will be progressed by the Parish Council.

The second was the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council on Monday the 15th May, in the Community Hall, attended by five Councillors, one member of the public and the Clerk. Basically this was to elect the Chairman and Vice Chairman for the coming year, together with Representatives to Outside Bodies, which was duly done.

The final meeting was the Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council and this was held later the same evening in the Community Hall.

The Old Limestone Bridge was again to the fore, with one resident speaking passionately about the increasing volume of traffic using the bridge, but more especially the 44 tonne HGV's that still ignore the weight limit. At one point, during a traffic accident on the A1, there were THREE HGV's on the bridge at the same time! This has to stop, as it most certainly is not good, with further repairs now planned to the structure of the stonework. We have arranged a meeting with PCC Highways to discuss this and will involve the Community Policing Team.

We have met with representatives of Natural England to further the Parish's Nature Recovery Plan and resident's thoughts would be most welcome.

Parking problems in Nene Close and the access there onto Old North Road are part of an ongoing discussion with Peterborough Highways, as are the village footpaths. Some success to date insofar the footpath in Nene Close is much improved, as of course was the footpath some while ago around the area of the Church, and we will continue to ask for other areas of the village to be resurfaced/widened.

There was something discussed, totally new to the Council, about exploring the possibility of a Wansford Youth Council. You will no doubt hear more about this going forward and Cllr Jane Taylor-Pitt will be our lead on what could be a very exciting development.

So, that concludes this report and hope you would like to come to our next meeting which is in the Community Hall, 12th June 2023 at 7.30pm.

## THORNHAUGH PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Annual General Meeting of Thornhaugh Parish Council took place on 15th May 2023 in St Andrew's Church. It was chaired by Chris Smith and present were Yana Clipsham, Neil Croft-Taylor, Louise Molesworth, Camilla Plumb, Alan Frost and Deirdre McCumiskey (Clerk)

There were apologies for absence from Gavin Elsey (PCC Ward Councillor).

Chris Smith was re-elected Chairman as proposed by Yana Clipsham and seconded by Louise Molesworth. Chris Smith confirmed that she is looking to retire but other members of the council did not feel able to take over Chair at the moment and was she agreed to continue. This will be reviewed again at the next AGM in May 2024. Louise Molesworth was re-elected Vice Chair as proposed by the Chairman and seconded by Camilla Plumb.

**Police Matters -** there were no police representatives present, and nothing formally recorded although it was understood that there has been a break-in at Thornhaugh Hall and so residents should remain vigilant and be aware of securing property. In addition, the Chairman reported that several series of books have been removed from the Book Exchange. This may be a misunderstanding on how the Book Exchange works but it is sad that so many books are being removed.

**Highways Issues -** the Chairman said she is still lobbying National Highways re removing the layby on the A1 North just before the Thornhaugh turning. NH suggested that anyone who sees vehicles parked on the pathway or near misses when entering/exiting Thornhaugh should inform them on 030 123 5000.

**A47 Dualling Project -** the Chairman and Yana Clipsham attended a recent meeting relating to the A47 Dualling Project. It was an informative meeting with lots of details about routes and plans going forward. In relation to timing of the project, the project was delayed by the approval process from the Secretary of State and now the original target date of March 2023 has been delayed until late Autumn 2023. During June there will be public meetings set up to provide specific dates and construction plans and anyone is welcome to attend. These will be advertised in due course. The project is scheduled to run for c.27 months, therefore an estimate of September 2023 to December 2026 (indicative only). Working hours are 7am to 7pm, with road closures mostly from 8pm to 6am the next day. Prior notice of the various road closures will of course be publicised. It is anticipated that one piece of work may result in full closure for a couple of weeks whilst the new carriageways are connected. Diversion routes will be set up and appropriately sign-posted, with National Highways noting that diversion routes should not utilise local village roads. The four houses on the Southbound carriageway will have a new exit/access road to the rear of the properties. Access to/from A1 southbound will be via the PGRO entrance. The road (which is already in existence as a track) will join the new road around the Sacrewell entrance.

**Defibrillator Training -** Louise Molesworth is waiting to hear back from the organisation that runs the Defibrillator Training to arrange a convenient time for the training.

**Website Review -** the newly re-vamped Website went 'live; on 15th May 2023 and thanks are expressed to Jay Allsopp for all his hard work in making this happen.

**Social Events -** The Coronation Event did not get the necessary support to warrant continuing, but a very enjoyable private Coronation Party was held in Alan and Joan Frost's garden. Neil Croft-Taylor will order ten Coronation Coins for the children who live in the village. Neil Croft-Taylor and Camilla Plumb volunteered to organise a social event in September 2023. This may be in the form of a quiz/bingo/drinks' evening to be held in the church. They will get a group of volunteers together initially as an "ideas forum". The date of Sunday 10th December 2023 at 6.00 pm was agreed for the Christmas Tree Carol Singing event. The Chairman to check if the Ukulele Group are available.

Detailed comments and instructions from the Tree Officer on individual trees can be seen on the city council planning website: 23/00112/FUL -Erection of 2 x temporary shipping containers for 18 months at Abbotts Wood Service Station, Great North Road, Thornhaugh. Withdrawn by Applicant; 23/00474/CTR - fell and remove the 5 dead elm trees at the front of the driveway. To prune back the trees growing either side of the swimming pool to give clearance from the pool at 3 Old Rectory Drive, Thornhaugh. Awaiting Decision. From the Chairman's perspective, if the trees are dead, they need to be removed. As always, the Parish Council would support whatever the Tree Officer advises. No Objections and Planning Appeal for 22/00506/FUL- Change of use from agricultural land to garden land at Croft Farm, Meadow Lane, Thornhaugh. Awaiting Decision. The Chairman had checked on Planning Inspectorate Website but, as yet no date assigned for a hearing. There have been complaints that the paddock is being used for ball games which is a misuse of the paddock at least until after the Appeal result, but Peter Sharpley has agreed to put up signs confirming that the paddock is not part of the Holiday Lets. The PC agreed not to take any further action at this stage unless the appropriate signs were displayed and use of the land by holiday let guests continues.

**Annual Return for Year Ending 31st March 2023** – thanks are expressed to Karen Jones for carrying out the Internal Audit. The End-of-Year Accounts will be put onto the Website. The following:- Section 1 Statement of Accounts; Section 2 Annual Governance Statement and Section 4 Internal Audit & Report were approved and signed by the Chairman.

**Action Point for next meeting -** seek an update on John Clare Conservation Project (invite Hannah Joyce to the meeting).

**Heritage Project -** Martin Lewis had started a Heritage Project. Is this something anyone would like to pick up, or does anyone know of anyone in the village who would be interested in heading this up for us?

**Fly-tipping -** fly-tipping seems to be getting worse. We have asked for help from Gavin Elsey for extensive fly tipping off the A47. The City Council have dealt with the recent incident of broken glass panels being dumped on Russell Hill.

**Drains -** everyone to keep an eye on any issues with the drains after these past weeks of heavy rain.

The next Thornhaugh Parish Council Meeting will take place at **7.00 pm on 17th July 2023 in St Andrew's Church.** 

## SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Sibson-Cum-Stibbington Parish Council met on the 18th May to hold both their Annual Meeting and Parish Council Meeting.

Cllr. Beuttell gave her annual report.

"Good Evening, and welcome to you all.

The year has seen several planning applications, with nothing too contentious. I was involved in the appeal made by Pure Fuels application to HDC for change of use of the buildings at Nene Valley, and we are awaiting the outcome, however they have successfully applied to have accommodation for staff approved on the site. Last year we saw an application from Newlands to erect Industrial units on land south of Chesterton, however I am pleased to say that this application has now been withdrawn.

HDC have announced the review of their Local Plan, which was due to expire in 2036. However, Government requires that all Local Plans be reviewed on a 5 yearly basis. HDC have now called for "Sites" which means that developers can apply for use of land they currently have options on to be used for building of houses etc. We must be diligent in looking out for any application for the Sibson Site, which caused much contention a few years ago, and any other sites that may be looked at. I will keep residents and the PC up to date when I have information to share.

As you are all aware, we successfully applied for an LHI improvement grant to place Double Yellow lines along the Great North Road, to try and stop HGV lorries parking along the Road. Highways Cambridge continually inform us that this has been delayed, Weather etc. being their excuse. Having escalated my concern regarding this, I await further information, but am pressing hard for these lines to be placed as soon as possible.

We also, like the rest of the country have an ongoing problem with potholes, which we report, and although they are filled in, the work is not good enough to prevent them recurring.

We held our Platinum Jubilee party on the 4th June and this proved to be a great success. The PC planted and Oak tree on the Corner of New Lane to mark this occasion. Unfortunately, within a few months Queen Elizabeth II died, and I for one will miss her steadfast service to our country. The PC have ordered a replacement bench for the village to commemorate her life.

A 'Village Picnic" to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III, was held in the grounds on the Haycock Hotel on the 7th May, which also proved to be a great success with the weather being very kind. It was a pleasure to see so many children in attendance.

I would also like to welcome Charlotte Newman who replaces Wendy Gray as our new Parish Clerk, and I hope that you will all give her your support as she settles into her new position on the Parish Council.

Thank you once again to my fellow Councillors for their help and Support during the past year.

And finally, and most importantly, thank you for all our residents who attend our meetings. I would like to give my personal apologies for the change of dates we have had to make recently, which I know inconvenienced many."

Cllr. Beuttell was duly elected Chairman with Mike Bradshaw remaining Vice Chairman. Questions from attending residents raised some questions regarding Blocked drains along old North Road, and also the lack of signage when entering Stibbington from the A1 slip road. A request for more signs and replacement "Local Traffic Only", together with Weight Limit signs were requested and will be forwarded to County Highways for consideration. The continuing saga of potholes was also raised, and the standard of work already carried out was questioned. Comments will be sent to our Local Highways Officer. Cllr. Beuttell also confirmed that communication had been received regarding the Double Yellow lineage along Old Great North Road. Highways are awaiting a dry period to ensure Lines can be installed efficiently.

There were two planning applications at Waters Edge discussed, and our comments and observations will be posted on HDC website.

Huntingdonshire District Council are reviewing their local plan. It was strongly suggested that residents view the progress of this on the website WWW, Huntingdonshire, gov, uk and search for Local Plan Update.

Questions were raised about the fact that with the A1 closure traffic is still passing through the village both in quantity and speed. It was suggested that we ask for volunteers to monitor the works and congestion in the village when the A47 bypass works take place.

Several payments were authorised. The meeting was duly closed and the date of the next meeting will be **6th July, 2023 to be held in the Christie Hall.**

## The (continuing) diary of a parish council clerk

Organisations not only have an increasing number of rules. regulations and recommendations (the 3Rs) to establish a work culture and perhaps a brand but also to achieve legislative compliance. This means working within certain parameters and parish councils are no different. In fact, parish councils have been strictly regulated since the introduction of the Local Government Act 1972 and their business cannot be conducted without observing certain formalities.

The role of a parish clerk, amongst many other things, aims to achieve compliance in the work of a parish council. There are over 1000 pages of rules, regulations and recommendations summarised in a tome colloquially known as the Clerk's Bible but more formally known as 'Arnold-Baker on Local Council Administration' currently in its thirteenth edition, and I freely admit that I may never be fully conversant with all of its content in ten years from now, such is its complexity. But there are some reassuring rules and procedures that are easier to understand and which are similar to those used for a corporate board meeting, such as: all parish council decisions are made in a parish council meeting and recorded in minutes of the meeting which

members of the public are welcome to attend; no parish council decision can be made at meetings unless the item appears on the Clerk's agenda for their meeting (which must be published in advance of meetings on a parish council's website and parish notice board) - this gives everyone in the parish advance notice of what is to be discussed; all parish council decisions are voted upon by councillors; the Chairperson chairs meetings and cannot make decisions alone; and definitely no alcohol to be made available at meetings - hence the rush for the pub at the end of their meetings! Then there are rules about Planning Applications, accounts, expenses, minutes of meetings, HGV licencing applications,



data protection, weight limits on roads and bridges, speed limits, health and safety of children's play areas, parking, footpaths - the list could continue, yes, for 1000 pages.

So, what does a parish council do for you? It tries to positively influence and enhance the environment in which you live by making decisions that reflect the majority of views of its residents. A parish council is actually the lowest tier of local government, but potentially the most effective, which is right on your doorstep. We read about the politics of the Houses of Parliament but these seem far removed from the day-to-day realities of the work of a parish council trying to solve the problem of bins not being emptied, grass encroaching upon pavements, and too much traffic coming into our village.

Perhaps the question "what can you do for your parish council?" should also be asked. Every resident within their parish is able to raise a concern or a question to their parish council by contacting a parish councillor or the clerk (it must be in writing – sorry, another of those many rules!) and also to perhaps suggest a solution to an issue or any ideas that come to mind. There are also ways of addressing things yourself without contacting the parish council. For example, if a street light isn't working or you want to report a pothole, you can go straight to either your City Council or District Council, depending upon your local government structure. If you're troubled by noisy fireworks, a neighbour's bonfire, or a neighbour who is rather fond of playing loud music what should you do? Go to your City Council or District Council's website for information on how to deal with these issues. For example, the 'noise and nuisance' section of the Peterborough City Council website (https://www.peterborough.gov.uk) makes interesting reading and it's rather reassuring to know that the initial advice given is often to resolve issues informally with your neighbour to avoid starting out on a litigious journey with more rules and regulations within legislation! A chat over a cup of tea often helps – and cheaper too! To be continued.

Finally our Society activities continue with Visit to Blatherwycke Gardens (24/5) and our Summer Social/Open Garden/Music event on 24th June




