The Easter Communion service (a simple and accessible communion service) is at Wansford at 9.30 a.m. A service at Thornhaugh that day is to be confirmed – do check the church noticeboard.

Needless to say all are welcome at our services in any of our churches over this very special month in the church's calendar. There are simple, informal services and more formal services; hopefully something for everyone – do come and join us!

Where-ever your journeys take you in the next few months, may you be blessed and encouraged, and may you have good travelling companions! around us.

Readers of this magazine will know that Stibbington and Wansford WI have been long time supporters of Sue Ryder

Thorpe Hall, so we were very pleased to invite Zoe Noyes to talk. We gathered on a wet and wild evening, where we were happy to present Zoe a cheque for £100, from our Christmas card donation, and to hear about Sue Ryder at Thorpe Hall as well as Zoe's role within the organisation.

Thorpe Hall was built in 1600's for the Lord chief Justice - Oliver St John, as a private home. It has gone through a number of owners including Milton estate, with a variety of uses, one of which was a maternity home. In 1980's it was purchased by Sue Ryder foundation, and has been offering palliative





care for the people of Peterborough and the surrounding area, ever since. Not only does the hospice provide specialist palliative care with its inpatient unit, the hall provides care and support for people with life-limiting conditions, as well as supporting their families.

As a community fundraiser at Thorpe hall, Zoe works with individuals and corporations, supporting them in their fundraising. In addition she works alongside her fundraising colleagues putting together the events held locally, some of which can take a year to plan. With the money raised used to provide the much needed care of their patients and the maintenance of the buildings. Zoe was able to give an insight into the problems of looking after the grade 1 listed building.



WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL

As many of you know, Councillor John Stannage is unwell at the moment and unable to chair meetings at the present time. With this in mind and with the Vice Chair, Councillor Richard Clarke being on an extended holiday, the Council voted Councillor Tim Pearson in to chair the meetings for February and March. Very best wishes were extended to both Councillor John Stannage and former clerk Marie Lewis.

A member of the public from Nene Close was present and voiced concern over the garden waste that had been left behind the garages, Ward Councillor Gavin Elsey is chasing this up. They also asked for an update on the parking situation in Nene Close and was assured that efforts are still underway to secure funding to improve the situation.

The Council are still in the process of seeking a new clerk and all applications are welcomed.

We were very happy to host two Police Officers this month who came to listen to residents' concerns. A number of concerns were raised including the misuse of the river and trespassing onto private land at the side of the river as well as anti-social behaviour towards residents, the damage caused to the wood at the riverbank last summer, speeding around the village particularly by the zebra crossing and around the bridge, misuse of the path through Cross Keys Farm woodland area, poaching and fly tipping. The Police had not seen any reported crimes and urged residents to report incidents as they see them and gave advice on security cameras and other agencies that could help with issues such as illegal parking.

This month, two defibrillators have been purchased by the Parish Council and have been installed in Thacker's Close and Robins Wood. There is still some work to be done to ensure these are fully operational but I'm sure you will agree, these will be a welcome addition to the village, and we are very grateful to the residents who have agreed to have these installed outside their properties. As soon as they are both connected to the electricity supply and the emergency network, we will notify every one of their exact locations.

The bus route from Peterborough to Stamford via Castor, Ailsworth, Wansford & Wittering has now been approved and we are waiting to see the timetable, as soon as we have this, we will share it with the community.

If you would like to become more involved in the village, please do get in touch with any of the councillors, we would love to see some new faces on the Parish Council and a vacancy will be opening in April. If you have any concerns you would like to raise, please do come along to our **next meeting** at the **Community Hall** on the **11th of March at 7:30pm**

A final note to keep an eye out for all the extra flowers the Youth Council planted last year to bring a bit of colour to our lovely village as we look towards Spring.

Wansford Parish comprises some 211 dwellings north of the River Nene in the Peterborough City Council area. There are seven elected Parish Councillors, who work voluntarily and the Clerk's role is a paid position which is available immediately. The prospective Clerk would serve 6 months' probation and preferably be CILCA qualified. The Parish Council can provide training for a person who does not hold this qualification but is willing to work towards it.

SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Sibson-cum-Stibbington Parish Council met on the 1st February, 2024.

Ten members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were sent from Cllr. Wright.

It was requested that two further bins were ordered to be placed near the gate to the Sewage plant, and the additional Warning signs regarding being fined for non collection of dog fouling.

Residents were concerned regarding speeding along the Elton Road and New Lane, together with observations regarding speeding through the village in general. Residents were encouraged to attend a meeting to be held in Wansford Village Hall on the 8th February, where our local Police would be in attendance, to receive concerns.

Issues were again raised regarding Pure Fuels, and the odours and noise that is created emanating from the site. Residents also wished to document their appreciation for the installation of double yellow lines along Old Great North Road, however it was observed that the lorries arriving and leaving the Stibbington Diner were covering the lines. A Road sweep will be requested.

A resident followed up the request for a children's play area, however it was pointed out that it would be extremely expensive to implement.

The minutes of the previous meeting were duly signed.

Cllr. Bradshaw again raised the request for committee members for the Christie Hall, together with volunteers. It will be put to the public to see if we can attract any interest. The narrowing of the entrance to the bridge will be discussed at a meeting to be held In March, together with Wansford Parish Council and other partners.

Several payments were authorised.

Stibbington Outdoor Centre is to be sold by CCC, and the Parish Council were asked if they would be interested in acquiring it. After discussion, it was decided we would not pursue this and we to do not have the funds, and the continuing upkeep would be disadvantageous.

A request for signs to be erected regarding parachutists landing outside the perimeter of the Airfield. This to be investigated. Several lights were reported as not working.

The signal Box at Nene Valley Railway which was burnt down has been rebuilt and there will be an Opening Ceremony on Sunday 9th March. This will cost £5 per person should residents wish to attend.

The meeting was duly closed and it was announced that the **next meeting** will be on **Thursday 7th March, 2024**.

NEWS FROM WANSFORD AND KINGS CLIFFE PRACTICE

This month we are featuring our reception team. They play a crucial role in the smooth functioning of a GP practice, serving as the first point of contact for patients and contributing significantly to the overall patient experience. Their responsibilities extend beyond traditional reception duties, encompassing a blend of administrative, interpersonal, and organisational tasks.

One of the primary responsibilities of GP receptionists is to greet patients and visitors, both in person and over the phone. Our receptionists also have administrative responsibilities and include registering new patients, maintaining patient records, updating contact information and managing electronic or paper-based filing systems. They can also handle prescription queries and liaise with other health professionals. Maintaining patient confidentiality and adhering to healthcare regulations, is paramount for our reception team. They handle sensitive information and must ensure that it is protected and disclosed only as required by law.

Receptionists juggle various tasks simultaneously, such as answering phones, managing appointments, and handling administrative duties. Effective time management is key to ensuring the efficient flow of operations.

Our receptionists often encounter challenging situations, such as dealing with upset or anxious

patients and handling emergencies. Quick thinking and effective problem-solving skills are essential for navigating these situations and maintaining a positive atmosphere within the practice They also take a fair amount of abuse from patients and we remind patients that we have a zero tolerance and ask that you are polite and respectful.

With the integration of electronic health records and digital communication systems in healthcare, GP receptionists need to be technologically proficient. They use computer systems to schedule appointments, update patient records, and communicate with other healthcare professionals. In summary, GP receptionists are integral members of the healthcare team, contributing to the overall patient experience and the efficient functioning of a medical practice. Their diverse skill set, ranging from interpersonal communication to administrative prowess, makes them vital in creating a positive and organized healthcare environment.

1. Plant Hunting in China
By Rev David Ridgeway (Chairman of RHS Orchid Committee)
