

Remember, remember, the 5th of November.....so goes the children's rhyme about Bonfire Night. In the Church, we might not be remembering Guy Fawkes and his "crew", but November does have a theme of Remembering running through it. The month begins with the celebration of All Saints' Day and the commemoration of All Souls. The Saints of the church provide example and encouragement in our own lives, and indeed there are also so many "saints" we have known and loved who have inspired us as they have accompanied us on life's journey, who now rest in God's eternal care. We remember them and give thanks for them at All Souls-tide and we have a special All Souls' service at Nassington on 7th November at 3.00 p.m. All are welcome to this quiet, reflective service as we remember those we have loved, and indeed still love, but see no longer. 


Our Macmillan bake sale made a fantastic £190.50. So, thanks to the bakers, sellers and yummy treat buyers.

WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL



The Wansford Parish Council met on the 11th of October, with all Councillors present except Councillor Pearson who had given his apologies.

The Council discussed the appointment of a new Parish Clerk and has two possible candidates at present. Applications close on the 29th October and the candidates will be interviewed by Councilors Thorley, Stannage and Pearson.

The work of Parish Clerk is being done at the moment by Councilor Clarke which is much appreciated by rest of the Parish Council.

Mr. Stace gave us information that the stone wall on Peterborough Road was getting in a state of disrepair at the point where people were climbing over to get access to the play area. A set of steps here seem an alternative. PCC own the wall and will be contacted.

When the status of the defibrillator was checked, we found that the information by Heartbeat Trust was incorrect. It seems that they designated the unit to Wansford near Driffield in Yorkshire not Wansford Peterborough, this will be corrected and the servicing is not now required until 2023.

As regards the Community Hall we still do not have a reply from Greenwood Solicitors about the location of the deeds. Without these the process to register the property with the Land Registry becomes more complicated. The usage of the hall has reduced because some people are choosing the larger space available in the church. However, there's good signs that small parties are booking the hall for example for childrens parties. Charges are just £4.00 per hour.

The Old Leicester Road A 47 junction was discussed as nothing has yet been received from the Peterborough City Council and we will ask why the A 47 has not been reinstated as a Trunk Road given the level of HGV traffic. This seems to be breaking up the road surface at the back of Robinswood and creates a lot of noise as the lorries go past.

Living Villages magazine is changing and as there's only one more issue to come under the present management. We wish to thank all the people involved in production of Living Villages for the last few years. A new team has been found and they will want the present distribution to continue, as it benefits the villages in at least having a mouthpiece of what is happening within the villages, and allow the parish councils, local groups, and the church to keep us informed.

The picnic site and river frontage below it are being looked at and we have been talking to Sacrewell who have shown an interest in purchasing the land. This could be used to provide a café and also moorings for boats, as well as an entry point for people to put canoes, boats, and paddle boards onto the river. This would add greatly to the local facilities and reduce summer congestion on the bridge.

Next meeting 8^{th} November 2021 in the Community Hall at 7:30pm. All are welcome.

THORNHAUGH PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of Thornhaugh Parish Council took place on 20th September 2021 in St Andrew's Church. It was chaired by Chris Smith and present were Martin Lewis, Ashleigh Kewney and Louise Molesworth. In attendance were three Members of the Public, Ben Pridgeon (Bidwells), Nic Shaw (Riverford Organics) and Deirdre McCumiskey, Clerk.

Apologies were given from Adrian Rodgers and Gavin Elsey, Peterborough City Ward Councillor.

Bidwells and Riverford Organics made a short presentation on the proposed planning application on land at Sacrewell Lodge Farm:

Bidwells is acting on behalf of Riverford Organics in respect of its premises at Sacrewell Lodge Farm. The company is experiencing unprecedented growth and is seeking to increase capacity at the site to process its produce. Bidwells has been tasked with the preparation and submission of a full planning application for an agricultural packhouse to accommodate this growth and the processing of produce at the site. The proposed development would be sited adjacent to the existing facility, which would be retained and subsumed into the operations.

At the current time, they are in pre-application discussion with Peterborough City Council and expect to meet a Planning Officer shortly. However, they wanted to make the Parish Council aware of this application and to engage them in the process. They introduced the scheme which they are anticipating submitting the application in early November 2021.

A useful question and answer session took place including discussions on potential increased vehicle movements, noise management, etc, and the Parish Councillors were grateful for the information that was communicated to them and feel they have a better understanding of what is proposed and any impact this might or might not have for residents.

The Council was also pleased to get a better understanding of the Riverford Organics business ethos and its commitment to organic growth, local production and their approach to apprenticeships and training and their commitment to a fair-wage policy.

Public Forum - Ellis Molesworth stated that he is keen that the history of the village is promoted and made available to anyone who is interested in it. Martin Lewis has already gathered historical information and photographs as part of the Thornhaugh Heritage Project and plans to arrange a meeting for interested residents to further the project.

Defibrillator

The Chairman will write to the residents who donated money to purchase the defibrillator to inform them that the money has been ring-fenced and will be used to maintain the defibrillator over the next 10 years. The Parish Council will contribute towards the cost of the electricity in running the defibrillator. Louise Molesworth will organise a training day if enough residents express an interest in attending (this will be included in the next newsletter).

Village Get-Together

It was noted that 45-50 residents had attended a successful and enjoyable Village Get-Together on 12^{th} September 2021. Thanks are expressed to Alan and Joan Frost for hosting the event. It was noted that it had cost £357 which was an overspend of the £300 budget, but this had been pre-approved by the Parish Councillors.

Footpaths

The Chairman will write to Lindsey Freeman of Home Farm to ascertain if she is still interested in forming a Footpath Committee whereby residents agree to monitor a local footpath that they use. The Clerk will write to Lee Moore, Footpaths Officer, Peterborough City Council to request a definitive map (not a website link address) which shows the footpaths in and around Thornhaugh and request a list of who owns them.

Finance

The discussion relating to the need to establish a "minimum fund level" was deferred to the next meeting. There is a projected surplus at year end of £4,430 the balance over and above an agreed minimum would be available for projects.

Insurance

The Clerk explained that the current insurance company is no longer able to provide insurance cover and the current policy expires on 30th September 2021. She is in the process of obtaining quotations from BHIB, Came & Co and Zurich Insurance and will circulate these as soon as she has received them. A decision on which quotation to accept will be made by e-mail.

Highways England A47 Wansford to Sutton Scheme – it is trusted that the Highways Agency has continued to liaise with the residents at the four properties on the A1 Southbound about local access, especially now that there will be increased traffic from Riverford in the future. The Chairman will write to Highways England asking that, as part of this project, that the layby and entrance to Thornhaugh on the Northbound carriageway be addressed while they have traffic diversions and heavy equipment already in the vicinity.




