Augean Community Fund

January 2023

The **Augean Community Fund** uses monies provided by Augean under the Landfill Communities Fund.

The company's donations relate to its two landfill operations located at Thornhaugh near Peterborough, and King's Cliffe in Northamptonshire.

Recommendations on all grants from the Fund are made by King's Cliffe Environmental Association (KCEA) and Thornhaugh Environmental Association (TEA).

These two committees comprise volunteers from the villages of King's Cliffe, Thornhaugh and nearby, who are best able to represent local community priorities.

Application Closing Dates

There are usually two funding rounds each year, the next two closing dates are:

Wednesday 31 May 2023 decisions by Early August 2023

Wednesday 15 November 2023 decisions by End January 2024



Who can apply?

Groups with projects that are located within 10 miles of the King's Cliffe landfill site or the Thornhaugh landfill site may apply for grants. Priority will be given to applications received for projects located within 5 miles of Augean's Thornhaugh and King's Cliffe landfill sites.

What can you apply for?

Grants are available for capital improvement works to public amenity projects.

Examples may include:

- Village halls
- Community centres
 - Sports fields

- Nature reserves
- Public playgrounds
- Sports facilities

- Village greens
- · Cycle paths
- Country parks

You can apply for grants of between £5,000 and £50,000.

Projects must be available and open to the general public as defined by ENTRUST (the Landfill Communities Fund regulator), as a minimum, for 4 evenings a weeks, or 2 days a week, or 104 days a year.

It is perhaps no wonder that many major religions have a festival related to light in the darkest months of the year. For example, Hindus celebrate Diwali and Jews keep Hanukkah. There

seems to be a need in all of us to keep the dark at bay and to be reminded of the light. At the end of November, the Church begins the celebration of the Advent period when we await the coming of the Light of the World, Jesus.

We can look around for signs of light in the darkness where we see unexpected hope in places of seeming hopelessness, we can be encouraged by the companionship of others. And of course, we can seek to bring light and comfort to those around us who experience darkness in so many ways.

We look, also, to the light of Christ that shines in the dark places of the world and people's lives. That light is always present; as we will read again quite soon "The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness will never overcome it". May there be light for all of us in as the nights get longer, and of course we look forward to the coming of spring!





Roadwork information: A1 Wansford to Stibbington – bridge surveys and maintenance

The Highways Agency plan to carry out essential survey work to assess the condition of a bridge and other maintenance activities on the A1 between Wansford and Stibbington. They plan to complete this work over 15 weeks between **Saturday 21 October and January 2024** and will work between 8pm and 6am, weather conditions permitting.

Closures and diversions. To carry out the work safely, they will occasionally need to close the A1 southbound between Wansford and Stibbington, and divert traffic as detailed below:

- Saturday 21 and Sunday 22 October
- Monday 30 October to Friday 17 November
- Wednesday 4 December to Saturday 16 December
- Monday 8 January to Friday 22 January 2024

Whilst the A1 is closed, southbound traffic will be diverted from the A1 at Wansford and directed to follow the A47, A1260 Nene Parkway and A1139 Fletton Parkway, before re-joining the A1(M) southbound at junction 17, Fletton Parkway Interchange.

Escort through the works. It is recognised that there are a number of properties which will need access maintained during the work. If your only access to and from your property is via the A1, we will maintain this at all times whilst the road is closed. Please keep a copy of this information in your vehicle and you will be escorted through the closure. Please be patient as you may have to wait until it is safe to escort you.

Access arrangements. To mitigate rat-running of A1 traffic through Wansford, The Highway Agency will

be closing the Old North Road, between the A47 roundabout and Black Swan Spinney. Residents of Black Swan Spinney and Swanhill will be able to turn onto Old North Road. All traffic from Wansford village will be able to use the exit from Old North Road onto the A47. Whilst Old North Road is closed, it is kindly asked that you use Old Leicester Road to access to Wansford and Stibbington.

WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL

Wansford Parish Council(WPC) held it's 9th October 2023 Meeting in the Community Hall, and in attendance were five Parish Councillors, representatives from Wittering, Thornhaugh and Sutton Parish Councils, two members of the public and the Clerk.

To assist the Peterborough City Council (PCC) Budget Challenge 20243/25, a presentation was given on the PCC Budget Simulator by Ms Jill Evans, PCC Service Director for Corporate Finance.

A lively discussion took place and all residents within Wansford and the surrounding area were invited to participate in the challenge of Council Tax spend and thoughts on balancing the 2024/25 budget.

WPC representatives attended a recent meeting with Galliford Try (the main contractors for the Wansford to Sutton Dualling of the A47) on the traffic management proposals during construction work. Ensuring A47 traffic is not diverted through Wansford village is our priority and that was taken on board.

And talking traffic, we are still experiencing A47 'rat run' early in the mornings with associated speeding and some poor driver behaviour. It is proven that the Vehicle Activated Speed signs do work, especially when locations are changed with some frequency, so, WPC has purchased an additional speed sign allowing greater coverage of the village roads. Also, associated Designated Funds are available through this A47 Project and Wansford PC is making a bid to these funds for Environmental and Social improvements to our Parish.

The Old Bridge repairs have been completed, with the road re-opened to traffic on 29th September at 11.00 hrs, and within an hour two HGV's and four overweight vans had crossed! WPC and Sibson cum Stibbington Parish Council will rigorously pursue a solution to this 'just plain wrong' use of our Grade 1 Listed Ancient Monument which was strongly discussed at the Multi Agency Meeting in September.

Some time ago, you may remember a survey regarding bus services, or rather lack of them. The Wansford, Wittering, Castor and Ailsworth Bus Campaign Group is making some headway on securing a reliable, regular bus service for the villages, and we now have our MP Shailesh Vara backing us!

There have been meet-ups with our Community Policing Team and the Police and Crime Commissioner to discuss recent Cold Calling concerns and gatherings of large groups in the vicinity of the river causing distress to local residents.

We've had some good advice from the PCC Wildlife Officer, Rowan Rumball, over improving the Wild Flower area near the Nene Close Play Area, planting bulbs and wild grass mixtures being two ideas.

The Youth Council members, under guidance from Cllr Taylor-Pitt and parents, are to go forward with this, alongside growing saplings from acorns, beech nuts and conkers to plant out in a year or so on designated farmland within the Parish.

Litter continues to accumulate within the A47/ A1 road verges and the Village Litter Pick Group, kindly encouraged by Jane Hunt, tackles this on a regular basis. If you want to help, have a look on Wansford Facebook page for times and dates.

And to close, the next Parish Council Meeting is in the Community Hall, Peterborough Rd, on **Monday 13th November 2023 at 7.30pm** and you are assured of a warm welcome.

Stay Steady on your feet

Cambridgeshire County Council have launched an online fall-risk checking tool to help you understand the risks and simple steps you can take to stay active and independent. From the age of 65, the risk of having a fall increases but many are avoidable. The new tool, Steady on your Feet, is aimed at those who haven't previously had a fall but would like to understand what they can do to prevent this happening. It's easy to use, asking a short series of questions to help understand any individual risks you might have and providing an action plan to keep you active and independent while increasing your confidence and reducing the risk of falling. You can fill it in yourself, or ask a family member or friend if you need extra help. Suggested steps to prevent a fall might include arranging an eye or hearing test, increasing your activity levels and eating a balanced diet, or even looking after your feet and making sure you wear supportive footwear with non-slip soles. THORNHAUGH PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of Thornhaugh Parish Council was held on 26th September 2023 in St Andrew's Church. It was chaired by Chris Smith and present were Yana Clipsham, Louise Molesworth, Camilla Plumb, Nicola Rogers and Deirdre McCumiskey (Clerk)

There were apologies for absence from Gavin Elsey (PCC Ward Councilor)

Parish Councillor Vacancy - there had only been one applicant for the vacancy and the Parish Councillors were pleased to welcome Nicola (Nicky) Rogers to be co-opted the Parish Council

Police Matters - there were no police representatives present and nothing formally recorded. It was noted that some local farmers have had their equipment tampered with recently.

Highways Issues - the Chairman spoken with Sean Sharp of National Highways who is responsible for the maintenance, etc. of the laybys on the A1. He confirmed that he has been trying to get the layby closed and work done on the bus stop but is not getting support (he was refused a closure on 20th August 2023). He suggested the Chairman writes to Mark Lambert directly who is responsible for safety issues so that his and our request is being reviewed in tandem. An email has been sent (22nd September 2023) explaining, yet again, the situation and our concerns. The main request is to close the layby completely and to adjust the grass area leading to the bus stop so that we can at least be adjacent to the carriageway when pulling out of Thornhaugh. An acknowledgement has been received from Mark Lambert who has suggested a meeting. Proposed dates have been given and we await confirmation. The Chairman will keep everyone updated when she gets a response.

Social Events - the next event will be the Christmas Carols at 6.00 pm on 10th December 2023 at the Village Sign at the end of Meadow Lane. The Ukulele Band has been booked.

Update on the Village Sign - the Village Sign has been refurbished and put back in situ. A plaque stating King Charles III Coronation is due to be added.

Walnut - Removal of dead wood and restoration of crown height, as previously approved, to 4m at Browetts Cottage, 6 Russell Hill, Thornhaugh – No Objections and

23/01178/FUL - Change of use of agricultural land to dog walking paddocks including creation of associated parking areas — retrospective at Grange Farm Equestrian Centre, Old Oundle Road, Thornhaugh — Neutral, support if there is a caveat stating no development rights.

Augean Liaison Committee - the Augean Liaison Committee Meeting was held on 31st August 2023 at Augean's Kings Cliffe Site. We have not heard back from Martin Witherington on whether he is happy to continue being the Parish Council representative. The meetings have been very few and far between in the recent past - the last one 2019. Hally Hardie has been attending past meetings to stand in for Martin Withering. It is proposed that Chris Smith now takes this role on since Hally Hardie is likely to be relocating in the not-too-distant future. The meeting, also attended by a PCC Planning representative, was extremely informative and minutes will be circulated which the Chairman will send round to Councillors and put on the website. We were given an Augean corporate update to explain some of the changes since the last meeting, including the acquisition of Augean. They have been bought out by two financial investors who have left the running of the operations much the same. They are supportive of the Augean ethos and business style, which includes community support and sustainability. Augean went on to explain the next workphases for the site including continuing remedial work on areas not appropriately filled by their predecessors. They are looking to use on-site material for capping off to keep carbon footprint to a minimum, whilst ensuring appropriate and compliant finishing. Sites that have been completed and appropriately capped will return to "public amenity" sites. Part of the planning requirements is that the completed sites will be fully maintained by Augean for 30 years. Work at the Kings Cliffe site is due to cease at the end of 2026, with Thornhaugh finishing at the end of 2036. The Cooks Hole area previously being worked by Mick George is now back in the hands of Augean and they are preparing this area to be included in the Thornhaugh site.

There is an open day at the Kingscliffe site on 14th October 2023 and a Thornhaugh site visit was offered if there is enough interest. Please let Deirdre McCumiskey know if you would be interested in a tour of the Thornhaugh site.

State of Russell Hill - the Chairman has again reported the state of the road going to the A47. Previously Peterborough Highways deemed the road in reasonable condition. However, there is now grass growing through the tarmac in the centre of the road in several places. The Chairman has therefore reported this (18th September 2023) once again for inspection.

Dog Foul Bin – the dog foul bin on Russell Hill has, for some reason, been removed. This has been reported to the City Council for urgent replacement (chased again 18th September 2023).

Asbestos waste was reported as being dumped on Old Oundle Road. This has been cleared away.

The next Thornhaugh Parish Council Meeting will take place at **7.00 pm on 6th November 2023** in St Andrew's Church.



Autumn planning for the bugs in your garden

We help take care of the birds and hedgehogs in our gardens during the winter by putting out food, or creating places for them to hibernate, so why not take care of the bugs they depend on for food as well! Here are ten things you can do to keep your wildlife happy this autumn.

- Wooden pallets make brilliant Bug Hotels. Fill with natural materials such as straw, twigs or pine cones and cover with plastic sheeting.
- Bamboo canes can be wedged into plastic plant pots. Great for hibernating in but also for nesting bees in the spring.
- Nectar is important food for insects and usually scarce in the winter. Plant late blooming flowers such as Michaelmas daisies, Sedums, Ivy or Asters.
- Compost heaps attract woodlice, worms and millipedes which break down your garden waste, and also make great nest sites for bumblebees.
- Leaf piles are a perfect shelter for invertebrates but if you want to keep it tidy you can hide them behind the garden shed.
- 6. Winter is the best time to start tree planting. Trees such as oak, willow, hawthorn, beech and gorse are great as many bugs are dependent on these



- Create piles of dead wood in shaded areas to attract earwigs, centipedes and woodboring beetles.
- Masonry bees often nest in old walls and ensure pollination of your garden plants. Avoid repointing walls until spring when the bees have woken up.
- 9. Butterflies and ladybirds

can be found hibernating in your home. If you find them, gently move them into an outside building to stay safe until spring.

10. Autumn is the perfect time to plan what to with your garden next year. How about a small pond or a wildflower patch?


