# Today's women working for tomorrow's world



There was excitement at the end of August, as the first major outing for our group, at The Wansford show. WI held a children's tombola, it was a fantastic day, a real team effort with the members setting up early, and volunteering to help throughout the day.

Many children won treats of toys, snacks and drinks.



Prizes were kindly donated by members, and all were won. Thanks goes out to the whole group, with a big thank you to Lucy (our Chair's granddaughter) who was an invaluable help throughout the day. It was so good to be involved as a part of a village event. Plans are already afoot for 2022!!

The stall enabled the group to raise much needed funds since meetings and fund raisers have not been able to take place, just the same as many other charity groups. Money raised will be put to good use, allowing a full programme as we go forward now that monthly meetings can take place, and the committee are putting together a programme





On Tuesday 14th September we celebrated our first meeting with a wonderful talk by Susannah O'Riordan, from Butterfly conservation. She explained their current project 'Chequered Skippers - taking flight' The Chequered Skipper became extinct (England) in 1976, only a small population currently found in Western Scotland. Previous attempts to reintroduce the species Susannah's have been problematic.

realised that it was important to get the habitat right for the caterpillars, Location, location! The search was on across Europe to find a

breeding population that lived in conditions that UK could replicate, providing suitable food for the caterpillars - damp glades, woodland rides, tracksides, wayleaves and woodland edges. Rockingham Forest fitted the bill, and a breeding population in Belgium where in 2018, 32 female and 10 male donor butterflies were given a full health check before transporting to Rockingham, the initial release was captured on Spring Watch. They were monitored, with butterflies seen in 2019. A second set of donor butterflies were introduced to help with the establishment of a stable breeding population. The observant amongst you will have noticed the work done within old Sulehay to set up the ideal habitat, the aim being that these small fast flying brown and orange butterflies (2-3cm) will be able to establish within our local woodland. Future talks will update us on this fascinating project.

# SIBSON-CUM-STIBBINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Sibson Parish Council met at The Christie Hall on Thursday 2nd September 2021.

#### THE MEETING WAS HELD UNDER STRICT COVID 19 CONDITIONS

6 members of the Parish Council and Parish Clerk were in attendance and were also joined by 2 members of the public.

Apologies were received from Cllr M Beuttell and Cllr D Price, also County Cllr S Bywater.

Cllr Bradshaw welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Declaration of Interest in Business to be Transacted -- Cllr Bradshaw re Planning Application 21/01983HHFUL.

Public Forum –Mr Clarke, Old North Road, Wansford – Cllr on Wansford Parish Council explained situation re Living Villages Magazine – they will be discussing at their Parish Council meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> September, Cllrs from Sibson-cum-Stibbington would be welcomed.

Mr Clarke also provided an update on the A47 upgrade – planning application (DCO) now published – people need to register to view.

Planning Applications (New):

21/01983/HHFUL construction of rear single storey extension to house and new car port in existing garden area at 1 New Lane, Stibbington – No objections raised.

Email from resident re NE/21/01184/LDP from North Northants Planning asking if Parish Council will be responding as very relevant to residents of Waters Edge.. No application found on website.

Flooding - Drains near Haycock, New Lane, right along the road.

Reports - Resident reported - people relieving themselves by the Churchyard - cars and lorries parking up - public right of way! Could we have a sign (to try to dissuade individuals (agenda item for next meeting)? Cllr Engel - could we have a new dog bin behind end of New Lane? (Agenda item for next meeting).

Stibbington Diner – a lorry company applied for licence to work out of Café (Car Park area).

Gentleman with paddle board and dog seen down by the river poaching fish. Front Garden dug out by Cllr Engel's property?

Cat shot near Cllr Bradshaw's factory. Someone also shooting on the airfield?

Bollard damaged on the bridge (New Lane) before turning into Café. Pot holes also reported in New Lane.

Date of next meeting – Thursday  $4^{th}$  November 2021 commencing at 7 p.m. in The Christie Hall.

## A47 Wansford to Sutton Dualling Update - October 2021

Highways England have now completed their preliminary work on the design of the A47 Wansford to Sutton Dualling Scheme. In early July 2021 Highways England submitted a set of documents to the Planning Inspectorate as the start of the Development Control Order (DCO) process. This is the equivalent of applying for planning permission except that, for a major infrastructure project such as this, the application is to the Secretary of State for Transport rather than to the local council.

After reviewing the documents, the Planning Inspectorate asked for some documents to be enhanced and they then accepted the application.

If you type **A47 Wansford to Sutton National Infrastructure Planning** into your favourite search engine, it will take you to the Planning Inspectorate web site which gives the full details of the scheme and how to participate. To take part in the DCO process you must register as an "Interested Party" with the Planning Inspectorate by the 21<sup>st</sup> October 2021. To do this on line you must read **Advice note 8.2** which is on the Planning Inspectorate web site. Alternatively, you can dial the helpline on 0303 444 5000 or email

## a47wansfordtosutton@planninginspectorate.gov.uk.

Once you have registered, you will receive information about the rest of the process. Essentially there is a Preliminary Meeting at the end of the registration period and then the Inspectorate will consider the application for about 3 months. After that there will either be a public hearing or, more likely, a further round of written submissions. Wansford Parish Council will be participating in all these processes, working closely with Sutton Parish Council and PCC.

Following a further period of consideration, the Planning Inspectorate will submit their recommendations to the Secretary of State who then has 6 months to decide. It is likely that the final decision will be made in the first quarter of 2023 with construction starting some 6 months later.

As reported previously, Highways England have made quite a few improvements to the scheme to the East of the A1. Controversially they intend to close off the southern access into Upton. Unfortunately, they are proposing to make no changes to the roundabout at the top of Old North Road Wansford because they consider it to be outside the scope of the project. It appears that Highways England think in "Corridors" not networks so they do not consider how the various corridors are linked together.

Not making any changes to the Wansford western roundabout will make entry onto the A47 at this point progressively more dangerous as traffic increases. Traffic is likely to increase by around 30% in the next 20 years and as a result the roundabout will choke up regularly, as it already does on occasions. The economic justification for the whole scheme is based on savings in travel time but the congestion on the western roundabout will significantly reduce the savings.

Building a traffic light controlled junction instead of a roundabout will make access onto the A47 safer but the only long term solution is a completely

different type of junction, as is being built for traffic leaving the A1 southbound to head towards Peterborough.

Ultimately the A1 at Wansford will be realigned, as was proposed in 1994. When this happens depends on government funding. In the meanwhile, the residents of Wansford can look forward to steadily deteriorating access to the road network and an increased risk of road traffic accidents.

# **WANSFORD PARISH COUNCIL**



The Parish Council (WPC) meeting was held in the Community Hall on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2021.

All Councillors were in attendance with two members of the public present. Councillor Elsey sent his apologies.

The future of the Living Villages magazine was discussed at length and Rod Sortwell gave a comprehensive overview of the position. Advertising revenue has progressively declined and there has been a marked decrease in articles from the local community. Basically, income is less than costs. The present editorial team has been in place for six to eleven years and would like others to take over the running of the magazine. Options of quarterly publication, on -line and subscription were discussed, but none seemed viable.

So, community, what do you think? Any budding editors with fresh ideas? The Parish Council will support you, as it has the present magazine and our thanks go to Tracy and her team for the effort and dedication shown over the years.

We are still without a Clerk after the very sad loss of Jill Sardeson, but we do have two ladies interested in the position, and of course, if anyone else would like to apply, please contact myself at <u>j.stannage@btinternet.com</u> at your earliest convenience.

A working party is to repaint the Telephone Kiosk on Old North Road, hopefully commencing on  $25^{th}$  September.

Planning Applications were mainly for tree work around the village although one was discussed that is in Yarwell Parish concerning gravel extraction. WPC support Yarwell Parish Council in objecting to this as it will further despoil the Nene Valley and likely create a considerable amount of HGV traffic through our village.

And now we come to the A47! The proposed route presented by Highways England (HE) to the Planning Inspectorate, it has to be said, is improved on the previous offering insofar as there will be less encroachment towards the river. This has been achieved by moving the proposed carriageway ten metres north into the SE corner of the Scheduled Monument field. As WPC has continually affirmed, there are not likely to be any artefacts in that section as it was quarried, probably to build the present A47. However, the western roundabout at the end of Old North Road will be a disaster waiting to happen as HE has chosen to exclude it from the present plan.

Another battle to fight, I would say!

The next WPC meeting is on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2021 at 7.30pm in the Community Hall and you are most welcome to come along.

#### **BEWARE MAIL THEFT**
